Father Hopkins to Mark 40 Years in Priesthood

New Dorp Pastor Founded Church In 1922

The Rev. John J. Hopkins, who has been pastor of Our Lady Queen of Peace Church, New Dorp, since its inception 23 years ago, will celebrate the 40th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood on Monday.

Father Hopkins was ordained by the late Cardinal Farley in St. Patrick's Cathedral, Manhattan, June 18, 1905. The first nine years of his priesthood were spent as chaplain at the Catholic Protectors in the Bronx and as assistant at St. Bernard's Church, in Manhattan.

Cardinal Farley then appointed him pastor of the church in New Paltz, N. Y., where he served until his appointment by the late Cardinal Hayes to start a parish in New Dorp.

Built Two Churches

During his pastorate in New Dorp, Father Hopkins has built two churches and a parochial school.

Parishioners of Our Lady Queen of Peace will present Father Hopkins with a spiritual bouquet of masses, rosaries and prayers at a solemn high mass to be offered in the church at 9 o'clock Monday morning.

The Rev. Nicholas J. Moore and the Rev. John Leddy, assistants to Father Hopkins, will take part in the mass in his honor Monday morning.

Also participating will be the Rev. Timothy Carmody, assistant at St. Margaret-Mary Church, Midland Beach. Father Carmody, who was ordained to the priesthood several years ago, received his early training at Our Lady Queen of Peace Church.

Church Dedicated in 1929

When Father Hopkins came to New Dorp in 1922 to establish the church he was obliged to celebrate mass in a frame building. He immediately began plans for the erection of a church, and in 1929 the present commodious edifice on New Dorp lane was dedicated.

The mission Church of Our Lady of Lourdes at New Dorp Beach was also built under the direction of Father Hopkins.

In 1930 Father Hopkins was a delegate to the Eucharistic Conference at Carthage, in Tunis.



A reading from the first Book of Kings

In those days, Elijah the prophet went to Zarephath. 
Prayer for Our Jubilee Year

Home Blessings!

Have you thought of having your house blessed? During our Centennial year of Our Lady Queen of Peace would be a perfect time to have your house blessing! Just contact the parish office and set up a time when the priest can come over, bless your home and family, and enjoy time to meet with you. The meeting is very informal and takes little preparation on your part. It's a great opportunity to connect as a domestic church with both God and your priest. We look forward to celebrating your "home" church.

We often bless our homes on the feast day of the Epiphany. On this day, we'll inscribe the initials of the first names of the kings (C, M, B) and the year on our doors. The blessing is a beautiful family tradition that acknowledges the sacredness of our "domestic (home) churches." But wait, there's more. There is an Eastern European tradition (I believe a Polish tradition) where a family invites the priest over to bless a home during the time from the feast day of St. Stephen (December 26th) to the feast day of the Baptism of the Lord (often celebrated as late as February 2nd). This is a great reflection on the importance of these traditions. This tradition has strong liturgical roots as well. The main purpose is to invoke God's blessing upon the house, as the priest sprinkles holy water and invites God into the home. It is stunning as it connects them to the Church, and our faith. Most priests have done numerous house blessings over the years. These blessings are also a great way for the priest to connect with families, and pray with them. (As well as a time to enjoy a good cup of coffee and possibly, a favorite dessert, with the family). Just call the parish office and set up a date and time!


