

PASTOR'S NOTE

Dear Saints,

We're more than halfway through Lent. How does it feel when you read that?

For me, it's some mixture of relief and regret. Relief, because meeting the challenge of living penitentially isn't easy (even though it's fruitful) and there is light at the end of the tunnel. Regret, because I'm running out of time to turn things around, that I haven't made the most of this

sacred season.

Does that sound about right? For both of those reasons (and more, I'm sure), now seems like a great time to recommit ourselves. Let's do so in two ways:

1. Persevere in the penitential practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. I'll give you a hint here: go small! What do I mean? Find five more minutes for silent prayer or bible reading, give up sugar in your coffee or butter on your toast, and be just a little more generous than you usually are with your money. The idea is that the little sacrifices still stretch us, but they give us nothing to brag about. This puts a good check on our motivation to perform penances.

2. Remember that this season is all about love. Lent needs to make us more loving. We can break it down and say that prayer is about loving God more, fasting is about living a disciplined self-love, and almsgiving make us more attuned to the needs of our neighbor. But we don't need to say that: We can just use every moment we have left as an opportunity to love God with our whole heart, soul, strength, and mind, and love our neighbor as ourselves.

Please pray for me, my friends. Be assured of my prayers. May the Lord make our final weeks of Lent fruitful.




STEPHEN MINISTRY CHRIST CARING FOR PEOPLE THROUGH PEOPLE

SCHOOL NEWS & NOTES

March 27th, 2022



INQUIRY AND DISCOVERY

OLMC 3rd graders were bursting with excitement as they left school recently! Assistant teacher Mrs. Tyrrell facilitated a hands-on science lesson in which students could examine an octopus, crab, squid, and clams up close. They had been studying invertebrates and vertebrates, but holding these sea creatures brought the scientific classifications to life.

At OLMC School, science class is about exploration. Each lesson is designed to awaken students' innate curiosity while inspiring wonder and awe. These lofty goals demonstrate our confidence both in inquirybased education and in the abilities of even the youngest students. For our 3rd graders, the definition of an invertebrate was the starting point for the lesson in which they could test and examine these characteristics for themselves. As they recorded their own observations, they were learning more about the wonderful differences in the natural world, and also learning to think like scientists!

These skills of observation and inquiry are especially evident in the study of science, but they are also characteristics of an active mind. The more our students are invited to articulate and explore their own questions, the more their questions captivate them. These 3rd graders were not just talking about what they had learned that day, but for many days following as well. Through their study of these particular ocean invertebrates, they experienced knowledge both as mastery in the present, and also knowledge as a quest that gives light and meaning to every day. "Seeing the sun, the moon, and the stars, I said to myself, 'Who could be the Master of these beautiful things?' I felt a great desire to see him, to know him, and to pay him homage."

SYNOD LISTENING SESSIONS

In early October, Pope Francis launched the Church on a two-year path of worldwide consultation, which is called Synod 2021-2023: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission"

What is a synod? In Church terminology, the word "synod" means a meeting of the faithful to discuss the doctrinal and pastoral needs of the Church. It comes from the Greek word that means "meeting", but its roots have the connotation of going along the path or way with one another.

These types of meetings range from a gathering of bishops from around the world, to a local gathering of people from throughout a diocese. This worldwide synod is historic, in that Pope Francis is calling all the faithful of the whole world to gather together for this two-year synodal process. Not to gather in the same geographic place, but to gather with the same purpose.

The purpose of the Synod is primarily about listening. First, listening to the Holy Spirit. Second, listening to one another. The goal is to discern how all of us—as the entire Body of Christ throughout the whole world—are being called by the Holy Spirit to better accompany one another along the way. And, don't forget: Jesus is the Way! (John 14:6)

The Synod will go through different phases over the next two years: parish, diocesan, national, continental, and universal. The parish phase has already begun and will continue through early May. To that end, OLMC will have three listening sessions. One just for teens and two general sessions:
