



CANTATE DOMINO

Music is an integral part of a curriculum that is both distinctly classical and authentically Catholic. At OLMC School, our students are taught music primarily through singing, making music class a vivid illustration of our school culture—one we delight in sharing with our parish community.

The study of music highlights one particular hallmark of classical education: engaging the whole student. Singing requires both physical and mental effort, as students strive to perfect their understanding of music theory and practice through listening and imitation. As they sing together, they become sensitive to their surroundings, valuing both their own contribution and the necessity of working together with others to create a unified sound. Our Middle School students are currently practicing *Cantate Domino* for their spring concert, learning that singing a "joyful song to the Lord" requires discipline, practice, understanding, and joy! Somber faces translate into subdued expression of what is intended to be an exultant outpouring. And yet, exultant outpouring without diligent preparation runs the risk of producing merely noise. By harnessing both the preparation and emotion, our students then can both experience the beauty of the impressive work of Giuseppe Ottavio Pitoni and delight in performing it for others.

Music also invites all our students to a particular entry into the liturgical life of the Church. Singing traditional prayers, chants, and hymns aids our students in their participation at Mass and Adoration, while also contributing to the liturgical celebrations for the entire community. As we all join together in singing *Tantum Ergo*, we are experiencing a unity in song and in prayer that has the power to move all of us towards greater unity in the sacrificial love of Jesus.

HOLY THURSDAY ALTAR OF REPOSE

"Can you not watch one hour with me?" (Mark 14:34)

This was the cry of our Lord's Sacred Heart when he found his friends asleep in the Garden of Gethsemane on the night when He was betrayed and entered willingly into his passion. On Holy Thursday, the Church offers us an opportunity to "watch with Christ" through a visit to the Blessed Sacrament at the Altar of Repose immediately following the 7pm Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday on April 14th downstairs in Gordon Hall. At the end of the Holy Thursday Mass severs "strip the altar" by removing sanctuary linens and anything moveable, they make sure that crosses and statuary are covered, they silence the church bells, and the priest removes the Holy Eucharist from the Tabernacle and brings It in great procession to an Altar of Repose away from the Sanctuary. When the Eucharist has been reposed and reserved in the alternate Tabernacle, the faithful are invited to "watch" with Christ in prayer until the Blessed Sacrament is removed from the Altar of Repose during the 3pm Celebration of the Lord's Passion the next day in the following afternoon of Good Friday. To participate in this time of "watching with Christ" at the Altar of Repose at our Lady of Mount Carmel, we invite watchers to sign up between

the hours of Thursday, April 14th, at 9pm until 3pm on Friday, April 15th. In addition to watching at our Altar of Repose, we also invite the faithful to participate in another excellent traditional Holy Thursday devotion and pilgrimage associated with this time of watching called "The Seven Churches Visitation" which invites worshippers to visit the Altar of Repose at any participating seven Catholic Churches before midnight on a Holy Thursday.

Jesus has called us His friends—let us faithfully follow Him wherever He leads us and prepare our hearts for the Feast of His glorious Resurrection—Easter Sunday.
