PASTOR'S NOTE

Dear Saints,

This weekend, we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday.

The Gospel passage we read to commemorate this Feast is powerful. Jesus appears to his Apostles, makes himself known to them in the wounds of his crucifixion, and extends his peace to them. Jesus' closest friends - the men who abandoned and betrayed him - are restored to friendship with God.


In the 1930s Jesus appeared to Sister Faustina Kowalska to renew the message of Divine Mercy. Devotion to Divine Mercy has since spread through the Church to every corner of creation.

The three main themes of the devotion - and the focus of the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet - are 1. to ask for and obtain the mercy of God, 2. to trust in Christ's abundant mercy, and 3. to show mercy to others and act as a conduit for God's mercy towards them.

Here we see the power of trusting in Jesus: in him we receive the mercy of God, and in him we are made vessels of his mercy (his bountiful and forgiving love!) to everyone we encounter.

EXPERIENCING MERCY AT THE FOOT OF THE CROSS

A beloved Lenten tradition at OLMC School is the Living Stations of the Cross. Presented by our 8th grade class, the entire student body gathers to pray together during Holy Week. It is inspiring to see each 8th grade class carry the responsibility of leading us in prayer through their devout and diligent preparation of the Holy Way of the Cross.

The Living Stations are especially poignant as all our students enter into the familiar Passion narrative by watching their peers take on key roles in the events of Jesus' Passion and Death. They not only see the story brought to life before their eyes, but they are invited to imagine themselves as part of the story. They are given an opportunity to experience the universal nature of Jesus sacrifice; he died not just for the people he walked among during his earthly life, but for each one of us. Each of us betray him when we sin, each of us experience the mercy of his forgiving love. And, most importantly, each of us imitate Jesus himself when we radiate his love to one another.


