

PASTOR'S NOTE

Dear Saints,

Happy Easter! This is our second of seven weeks in the Season of Easter, so I figured I'd take that as my jumping-in point.

We're all familiar with the season of Lent and its various disciplines, but I don't think we connect our penances, mortifications, and the like to our celebration of Easter. We should.

Our Lenten observances and practices should enable us to celebrate Easter with more devotion and joy than we'd otherwise experience. This is the case for at least two reasons: 1. We are, as a result of Lent, more focused on God and his purposes, and 2. Our appetites (our desire for satisfaction of all sorts) being better ordered, we are free to enjoy God's good creation as he intends.

Has this been your experience? My Easter has been a bit uneven in this regard, but I'm definitely experiencing improvements over recent years.

During the Easter Season the Church has us meditate on the post-resurrection appearances of Jesus and on the Acts of the Apostles. This makes a lot of sense: Jesus is risen, and the Church witnesses to his Lordship in the world.

There's a lot to be said about this, but let me just offer one point:

This week in our reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we heard Saint Peter say, "We must obey God rather than men." By raising Jesus from the dead, God has marked him out as the Jewish Messiah and the Lord of all Nations. This makes Jesus the rightful ruler of every human heart, and it is ours to entrust our hearts and lives to him (faith) and follow him where – and how – he leads (obedience).

THE SHRINE OF ST. THERESE REOPENS

TODAY! MAY 1ST, 2022

The Shrine of St. Therese of the Little Flower reopens this Sunday, May 1st. It is located on 54 Rock Lane, Boonton (border of Mountain Lakes), and the hours are 8:00am to 6:00pm daily.

This beautiful Shrine of the Little Flower was erected in 1933 in fulfillment of a promise made for an answered prayer. Early in the 1920's, Mr. Achille Arci became seriously ill and was not expected to live. He fervently prayed to St. Therese for help. He made a promise that if he was cured, he would build a Shrine in her honor. After an almost five-year battle with the illness, he was completely cured.

For the next few years, Mr. Arci along with a society of devout Catholics worked hard to keep his promise. The Shrine was erected on his property and was lovingly maintained by Mr. Arci until his death in 1957.

Ownership of the Shrine was transferred to Our Lady of Mount Carmel in 1960. The Arci family continued the care and maintenance of the Shrine until 2020, at which time Our Lady of Mount Carmel assumed all responsibility and

began work on updates and renovations, thanks to a generous gift from the Bridget Christina Bergen Irrevocable Living Trust, as well as donations from many friends of the Shrine.
