REFLECTION

First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 80:9, 12, 13-14, 15-16, 19-20

Second Reading: Philippians 4:6 - 9

Gospel Reading: Matthew 21:33-43

Reflection: In today's First Reading as well as in the Gospel Reading, the image of the vineyard is central. In the First Reading God speaks of all the efforts He makes to make his vineyard fruitful. In the contrary the vineyards ends up with wild grapes. He puts forth a challenging question, "What more was there to do for my vineyard that I had not done?" In today's Gospel reading, Jesus speaks of the story of the landowner who works hard in his vineyard and he later entrusts it to the tenants. Seeing that the landowner is away, the tenants become disrespectful to the landlord's servants who are sent to collect the produce. The tenants end up killing the landlord's servants. They finally kill the landlord's son thinking he is going to inherit the vineyard. In the Responsorial Psalm we respond, "The vineyard of the Lord is the house of Israel." Yes! God had chosen the house of Israel to be his own people. He has made himself known to them in so many ways. He has done many wonders in their history. He has freed them from slavery in Egypt and driven them through the Red Sea. He gives them Ten Commandments and leads them through the dessert. He freely feeds them manna for forty years and he brings them in the Promised Land. Did the people of Israel respect God and remain loyal to Him? Reading through the Scriptures, we read the stories of unfaithfulness among the people. We hear stories of people's rejection of their God, stories of disobedience. Knowing good things God has done to us in acts of creation, redemption, and sanctification, are we loyal to our God? We are called to always be faithful and loving to Him. He is an awesome God. Yes! Amen! Fr. Severine

DISINFECTING OUR CHURCHES

Dear parishioners of BSC and SVC: Since the resumption of public Masses in our linked parish church building back in May, the practice of disinfecting pews has been an ongoing endeavor. Pews and other areas of regular contact have been getting disinfected after every Mass (daily, weekend, funeral or wedding Mass). We have been using an EPA registered Disinfectant/Cleaner to disinfect all pews that are used, and all "High Contact" touch points. The disinfectant is applied with a sprayer and allowed to have the "Contact Time" required for the disinfectant to work.

ALL SOULS MEMORIAL LITURGY

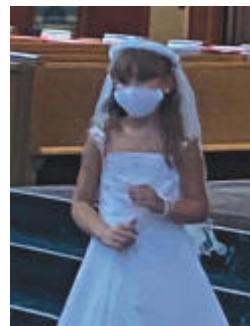
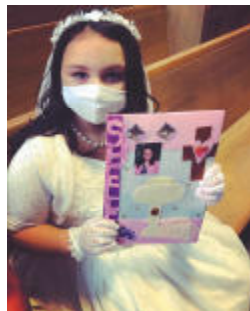

Dianna Evans will lead praying the rosary in front of Church on October 18th at 1pm. Everyone is invited to come and pray.

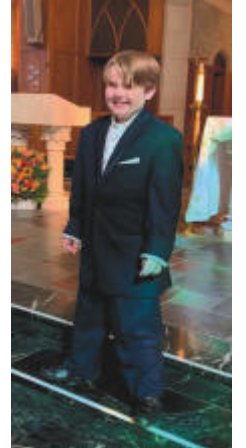

HOPE APPEAL WEEKEND

This weekend is HOPE Appeal Weekend! Together, when we pledge our gift to the Annual HOPE Appeal, we are giving thanks to Christ for the innumerable gifts we've been given and helping our friends and neighbors who benefit each year from the diocesan good works funded through our annual appeal. Fr. Severine is asking all parishioners to contribute to this year's HOPE Appeal. If we all give, we will easily meet our linked parishes' 2020 HOPE Appeal goals of \$53,000.00 for Blessed Sacrament and \$17,000.00 for St. Vincent DePaul. which are our parishes share of the support for HOPE Appeal-funded ministries, programs, and services. If we exceed our 2020 Hope Appeal Goal, 100 percent of the excess will be returned directly to our parishes. Normally, we keep 50% of the excess but this year the Diocese wants each parish to keep any amount collected in excess of the 2020 Parish Hope Appeal Goal. We plan to use these funds to support the underfunded ministries in our parishes. In an effort to meet our goal, I am asking every family in the parish to consider a minimum gift of \$175.00 (averages out to \$0.48 a day or \$14.38 a month). If you are able to contribute more, I strongly encourage you to do so. If you are not able to make the minimum gift, please give something. Your gift, no matter the size, whether it is a pledge or a one-time gift, is important. Thank you to everyone returning their HOPE Appeal pledge card this weekend! If you are still prayerfully considering your HOPE pledge, you may bring your completed pledge card to Mass next weekend or drop it by the parish office. You may also pledge your gift to our parish's campaign online at syrdio.org.

Church Teaching on Citizenship and Voting - "Citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation" *Evangelii Gaudium* ("The Joy of the Gospel"), Pope Francis, 2013 #61 Benedict XVI's articulation of the church's mission in political life: "It is not the church's responsibility to make this teaching prevail in political life. Rather the church wishes to help form consciences in political life, and to stimulate greater insight into the authentic requirements of justice as well as greater readiness to act accordingly." ("Deus Caritas Est," No. 28) The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops stated in "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship" in 2016 (quoting from their 1998 document, "Living the Gospel of Life"), "it is important for all citizens 'to see beyond party politics, to analyze campaign rhetoric critically, and to choose their political leaders according to principle, not party affiliation or mere self-interest'."
