REFLECTION

The 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 25:6-10a

*Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 23:1-3a,
3b-4, 5, 6*

*Second Reading: Philippians 4:12-14,
19-20*

Gospel Reading: Matthew 22: 1-14

Reflection: Our God is the God who provides us with our needs, our daily bread, our life. Everything comes from God. Paul in the second Reading tells the Philippians, "I know how to live in humble circumstances; I know also how to live with abundance...I can do all things in him who strengthens me." Paul has grown up in spiritual maturity to recognize that in whatever circumstance of life, God is present and he is the one who give us strength to move on. Isaiah is speaking of this God in the First Reading, God who has the power to prepare for his peoples a feast of rich food and choice wines. He speaks of God who is able to destroy death forever, God who will wipe away the tear of every face. This God as he is shown in today's Gospel Reading, has the power to prepare the wedding banquet, invite people to the banquet and continues to invite even when those whom he invited first refuse to attend the banquet. It is the realization of the power of God which makes the Psalmist to say, "The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. ...Only goodness and kindness follow me all the days of my life; and I shall live in the house of the lord all the days of my life.' We are called to surrender ourselves to God in all circumstances because our God is the God who is able. Yes! Amen!

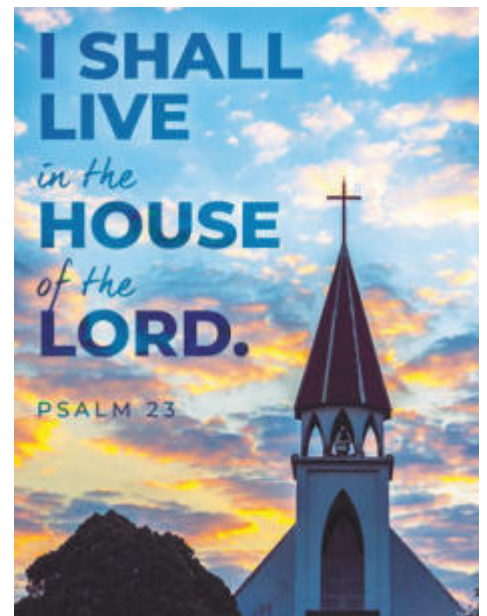

A Sign of Peace
One of the most important actions of the Mass is the Sign of Peace. This is a moment when we share the peace of Christ with those who are gathered around the altar. The Sign of Peace is offered at a very holy point in the Mass, just after the Eucharistic Prayer and just before Holy Communion, though it is not a mandatory liturgical act. All the Lord's Supper, Jesus tells His Apostles: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." During the Sign of Peace, we may feel nervous to shake one another's hands as a sign of peace, but we can pray that our hearts be open to the peace Christ offers and accept of it, and that peace is to be shared in the world. The Holy Eucharist is the sacrament of peace. In the Holy Mass we are united to the sacrifice of Christ through which we are reconciled to God. This is the source of true peace. The peace of the Lord be with you always!
In what ways can you be a "sign of peace" in the world?

October 18 - Memorial of Saint Teresa of Jesus, Doctor of the Church
St. Teresa of Avila, also known as a doctor of prayer, discipline, and contemplation. Her heart burned for God. One of her most famous sayings: "Let nothing disturb you. Let nothing make you afraid. All things are passing. God alone never changes. Patiently guard anything if you have God; you will wonder nothing. God alone suffices." How beautiful our lives would be if we could accept and live those words. If we could learn the secret of being nothing, nothing makes us afraid. If we truly believed that with God at our side, we need nothing else.
St. Teresa was named a Doctor of the Church in 1970, one of the first women to be so named.

October 18 - Feast of St. Gerard Majella
During the month of October, the Church celebrates the sacraments of us as if promises. Respect life always. Consent to the presence of life and accepting mothers and unborn babies. Celebrate the love and give life. Stay with your family until the very end. Respect life month. Choose a week or more of the following activities: create a book, have a life-size pregnancy center, give the story for the unborn, remember the health maintenance history, research, research, research a child.
St. Gerard was also known for his charity, discipline and selfless service. Here are a few of his most famous sayings. Use them to reflect on these virtues. What do these virtues mean to you?
• "Who saved? God can give you peace? Not the world ever. God alone can satisfy the heart!"
• "I see in my neighbor the Person of Jesus Christ!"
• "The Most Blessed Sacrament is Christ made visible. The priest only reveals Christ again made visible."

FROM PAUL WELCH

Pro-Life and the Death Penalty - The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that the Church teaches "the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person". Last week, William LeCroy and Christopher Vialva were the sixth and seventh prisoners executed by lethal injection since July 14, when the current administration resumed federal executions for the first time in 17 years. In the 60 years prior to July, there were only four federal executions. "After the first murder recorded in the Bible, God did not end Cain's life, but rather preserved it, warning others not to kill Cain (Gn. 4:15). As the Church, we must give concrete help to victims of violence, and we must encourage the rehabilitation and restoration of those who commit violence.

DISINFECTING OUR CHURCHES

Dear parishioners of BSC and SVC: Since the resumption of public Masses in our linked parish church building back in May, the practice of disinfecting pews has been an ongoing endeavor. Pews and other areas of regular contact have been getting disinfected after every Mass (daily, weekend, funeral or wedding Mass). We have been using an EPA registered Disinfectant/Cleaner to disinfect all pews that are used, and all "High Contact" touch points. The disinfectant is applied with a sprayer and allowed to have the "Contact Time" required for the disinfectant to work.
