REFLECTION

First Reading: Exodus 22:20-26 Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 18:2-3, 3-4, 47, 51 Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:5c - 10 Gospel Reading: Matthew 22:34 - 40

Reflection: As we hear in the Gospel Reading today, one of the Pharisees asks Jesus to test him, "Which commandment in the law is the greatest?" Jesus responds, "You shall love your Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.... The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Love is a very special divine ingredient that provides us with special capacity to understand things in their totality. When we possess the full understanding of anything, we are able to build up meaningful and health relationship. The love of self and the love of the neighbors is preceded by the love of God. As we read in the law, the love God requires us to engage all of our internal and external faculties: heart, soul, and mind. This is very important. We need to love God fully in order to get all benefits we need. When we love God fully, we will be able to spend more time with him, to listen to him and to understand his teachings and directives without reservation. By doing so we will be sort things not in our own ways, but in God's ways. Loving God partially or a little leaves us in the darkness of our own wills, our own understanding, and our own traditions. This amount of love, cripples us even in the way of loving ourselves and neighbors. In the today's First Reading God tells the Israelites, "You shall not molest or oppress an alien, for you were once aliens yourself in the land of Egypt." If I love God, I will listen to him and pay attention to his teaching. If I love God I will know the rationale and be able to make sense of his teachings. Ok! We are not to mistreat aliens because we ourselves were aliens. Ok! We should love all people because we have been created in the image of God! Ok! We should love and respect the whole creation because the whole creation is the work of God! When we love God, we will be able to better love ourselves and truly love others. Yes! Amen! Fr. Severine


FROM PAUL WELCH
