Reflection: Solemnity of Christmas, as it is the solemnity of Easter, is celebrated not as a single day celebration but rather as a cluster of 8 continuous days known as 'the octave of Christmas or octave of Easter. The octave of Christmas starts with the Christmas day itself and goes on to the New Year day (January 1). The celebration of the birth of Jesus continues beyond the octave of Christmas all the way to the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. During the octave of Christmas and the whole Christmas season, the church celebrates various feasts and solemnities surrounding the grand birth of Jesus. This Sunday the church celebrates the birth of Jesus as it is manifested in the holy family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Jesus was born and raised up not in isolation but in the neat family of Mary and Joseph who nurtured him as the baby, the child and later on as a grown up person. They raised him in their socio-cultural and shared with him those beliefs, attitudes, and values they believed and embraced in their lives. In today's Responsorial Psalm, we responded, "Blessed are they who dwell in your house, O Lord." Mary and Joseph walk with a young teenage Jesus into the temple in Jerusalem (the house of the Lord) to worship. Today's Gospel Reading starts with, " Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feat of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to the customs." Jesus is raised up in a family which embraces social and religious customs/practices of the tribe. Not only Mary and Joseph share their beliefs to each other and to Jesus but we see that in every family system, parents also are able to learn from their children. In this Gospel Reading, Jesus remains in the temple in Jerusalem. His parents search for him for three days and find him in the temple sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. As Mary questions Jesus, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." Jesus responds to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" This answer is too heavy for Mary and Joseph (and any other person) to assimilate but they keep it in their hearts and walk with him back to Nazareth. As we live in our families and communities, we need to open our minds and souls to learn from each other. Jesus is not only the child to Mary and Joseph but he is also their God and Savior. As Jesus is growing up in the house of his parents, Mary and Joseph grow up and become the first disciples of Jesus. Jesus opens to them the mysteries of eternal life. The main thing is not to comprehend what God is teaching us in our here and now moment. The main thing is to keep walking with him and spend quality time with God as our Father, creator, redeemer, and sanctifier. The more quality time spent with God as family, the more mature we become both with him and with each other. It is all about family as family is the foundation of all virtues. Yes! Amen! Fr. Severine.


