SPIRITUAL EXCERPT

CHARISMATIC

The word charism means a gift for others. If you apply the word charismatic to yourself, you're having a dream session. Because you can't decide you're charismatic, other people have to do it. But you see, when the apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit, they got something they didn't have before: joy and knowledge and all the gifts of the Holy Spirit. They had the same problems they had before: the Pharisees were still after them; they were still being persecuted. They didn't forget their problems; they went out to meet them. That is what a Christian is supposed to do. And that is one of our witnesses. You are now a free people, a holy people. You are unafraid of pain or sorrow. You feel it, but you're not afraid of it.

QUESTION

Why are Masses offered for the dead? The Mass is the central act of Christian worship. In it, the faithful gather with Christ in His reenactment of His offering of Himself unto death in total love to His Father in Heaven. No other work is richer in satisfaction than this. It is, therefore, fittingly offered for the dead. Further, as the central act of the Christian community, all the members of the family are represented and remembered – those in Heaven, those on Earth, & those in Purgatory. The communion of charity among all demands that none be left out.

The Holy Hour

INSPIRATION for the Holy Hour is taken from Matthew's gospel in which Jesus asks the disciples to keep watch with him as he prayed. When he returned to them and found them asleep He asked Peter why they could not watch with Him for only one hour in companionship.

BEGINNINGS

In 1673 Saint Margaret Mary Aloque stated that she had a vision of Jesus in which He instructed her to spend one hour every Thursday evening to meditate on the sufferings of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. Through the years many groups continued the practice and in 1909 received indulgences from Pope Pius X.

BENEFITS

Archbishop Fulton Sheen, a great supporter of the Holy Hour throughout his life made a Holy Hour every day, for three main reasons:

1. It is sharing in the work of redemption
2. The Lord asked his disciples to be with him
3. It helps us to grow more and more in his likeness

The Holy Hour is a collection of hymns, poetry, prayers and reflection for Adoration to inspire us to stay close to Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, guide our prayer and contemplation in His presence and spark the revival of silent Adoration that the world so desperately needs.

Saint Martin of Tours | November 11



Saint Martin of Tours was born a pagan in what is now Hungary around 316, but he was raised in Italy where his father, a tribune, was posted. At 15 he was compelled to serve in the Roman military, though he was already a catechumen. There is a popular legend that while on campaign the saint cut his cloak in half to share with a cold beggar. That night he dreamed of Jesus and his cloak was restored. He was baptized at 18. Only two years after his baptism, he was released from the military, he had refused his

battle pay and to fight saying he was a soldier for Christ. He is the first recognized conscientious objector. After his release from the military, he became a disciple of Hilary of Poitiers. He worked diligently against the Arian heresy, which denies the divinity of Jesus Christ, and established a community of hermits near Poitiers in 361, the first French monastery. In 371 he reluctantly became bishop of Tour. Nearby, he founded a second monastery, Marmoutier, because he preferred the life of a monk he retreated often. In 384 there was a popular heresy infecting the Church in Spain, led by the bishop Priscillian and his followers. The emperor Magnus Maximus became involved, ordering the execution of the heretics. Saint Martin opposed the executions and protested the emperor's involvement in Church matters. Unfortunately, the Priscillians were executed anyway. Saint Martin died in Candes-Saint-Martin, Gaul in 397. He is notably one of the first saints who was not martyred. He is the patron saint of France.

ARE YOU A REGISTERED PARISHIONER?

Occasionally there is a misunderstanding on Parish Registration; every family should be properly registered on our Parish Census by filling out a Parish Census Form. Young adults who continue to live in the Parish, should register as a new family. The Parish where you receive your Sacraments does not continue to be your Parish unless you are properly registered. Sponsor Certificates for Baptism and Confirmation and reference letters can only be given to those who are registered parishioners. Registration forms are available at the doors of the church and are also available at the Rectory Office or my email upon request. How many paintings are inside St. Peter's Basilica?

Venture a guess. One.

There is one painting inside St. Peter's Basilica.

"What?!" you might be exclaiming. "How? There must be hundreds of paintings in there!"

We kid you not. There is only one painting in that spectacular edifice. It is a depiction of the Holy Trinity by Pietro da Cortona and is located in the Chapel of the Blessed Sacrament.

All the other holy images are mosaics.

Mosaics are images created not with paint, but with tiny pieces of glass, ceramic, gemstones, or other materials. The oldest mosaics in the world are from the 3rd millennium B.C.. The art form really rose to prominence in the basilicas of the early Church, both in Rome and in the East.

The art of mosaics continued—with various peaks and valleys in its quality—for centuries and centuries, reaching a particular "golden age" around the 13th century.

St. Peter's Basilica was built mostly in the 1500s. Artists began installing the mosaics in the latter decades of that century. Most of them are reproductions of famous paintings that reside elsewhere, such as The Transfiguration by Raphael.

There are many places in Italy and in other parts of the world where you can see mosaics—including Rome, the northern city of Ravenna, and—if you want to see some of the most spectacular ever created—St. Mark's Basilica in Venice.




