

SACRAMENTS AT ST. LUCY's

Reconciliation: Saturdays at 4:00PM, or anytime by appointment



Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated monthly but must be scheduled weeks in advance. Active parishioners should contact your parish office to begin preparations.

Marriage: Diocesan requirements state that arrangements should begin at least 6 months to one year before desired date of marriage. Active parishioners should contact the parish office for more details.

Adult Confirmation: Preparation for RCIA, Rite of Christian Initiation & Baptism for Adults, begins in October. Candidates are prepared for sacraments at Easter. Contact your parish office for more information.

Anointing of the Sick: Chaplains are available at the local hospital during the day and in the evenings for emergency. Because of privacy issues you may have to ask to see the priest. However, if you know you are going, or know of someone who could use a visit today, please do not hesitate to call your parish priest.

LIFE (Learning In Faith Experiences - our all-ages Parish Religious Education Program)

Each May, the United States celebrates a day called Memorial Day, first widely observed in 1868. That celebration commemorated the sacrifices of the Civil War with a proclamation. After the reading of the proclamation, graves of more than 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers were decorated.

Since WWI, the day has become a celebration of honor for those who died in all America's wars, as well as those who are Veterans and current members of the US military. In 1971, Memorial Day was declared a national holiday, celebrated on the last Monday of May.

President Ronald Reagan revived the practice of honoring Memorial Day and its meaning. One of his famous speeches was given at Arlington National Cemetery on Memorial Day in 1986, a few excerpts follow. "Today is the day we put aside to remember fallen heroes and to pray that no heroes will ever have to die for us again. It is a day of thanks for the valor of others, a day to remember the splendor of America and those of her children who rest in this cemetery and others. It's a day to be with family and remember..." The observance of Memorial Day is much more than a day off from work or school, but truly a "day to be with family and remember." Thank you God, and thank you - all of our brave men and women who serve and have served in our United States military.


