"Father, what happened to the collection report in the weekly bulletin of the past Sunday's contributions?"

GLAD YOU ASKED

When we changed over to the new publishing company, I made a decision to forego the weekly report of the parish collections for a few reasons. Among them is security and privacy. In today's world where bulletins are published on the internet, we have to ask, is it wise to share parish finances with the world?

Secondly, what do the numbers really mean? Many families have turned to on-line giving, and many others are now contributing monthly or even annually by transferring funds from their retirement accounts (saving taxes from their required minimum distributions). Others "catch up" on their contributions when they go or return from their summer or winter travels. And then we welcome visitors to the parish whose numbers and contributions fluctuate each week. So the weekly collections actually placed in the baskets on Sundays varies greatly and really has little meaning by comparison to our overall annual budget.

My plan going forward, as discussed with the parish finance council, will be to publish a more meaningful report, perhaps on a monthly or quarterly basis. It is my hope this will begin when we have our new bookkeeper / accounting position in place. Of course the annual report to parishioners will be distributed toward the end of the summer - our financial year ended June 30.

In the meantime, glad you asked.
