

From the Pastoral Administrator's Desk

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT, YEAR C-April 6, 2025 God's Mercy and Renewal.

Dear Parishioners,

Grace and peace of our Lord, Jesus Christ be with you!

The Gospel for the Fifth Sunday of Lent continues to offer lessons about God's mercy, forgiveness and renewal. Last Sunday we heard the parable of the Prodigal Son from the Gospel of Luke. Today we hear the report from John's Gospel of an encounter among Jesus, the Scribes and Pharisees and a woman caught in adultery.

The Pharisees state clearly that according to the law of Moses, those caught in the act of adultery were to be stoned to death. Jesus avoids the trap however, by offering an answer that was not anticipated by those who posed the question. Jesus, after writing on the ground with his finger, addresses those who stand before him and suggests that the one without sin cast the first stone. Jesus then returns to his writing. The scripture reading by the way, is the only evidence we have of Jesus writing. These Pharisees are not as self-righteous as the portrait found in the parable of the Pharisees and the tax collector (see Luke 18:9-14).

Jesus asks where the accusers have gone. With no one remaining to condemn the woman, Jesus sends the woman on her way, refusing to pass judgement on her and exhorting her to avoid future sin.

Jesus' response to those who accuse the woman is more than a caution to us about making judgement of others. It is a profound lesson in divine mercy and forgiveness. As sinners, we are all unworthy to judge the sins of others and we would stand convicted by God for our transgressions. Yet Jesus offers us who are sinners his mercy and forgiveness. Redeemed by Jesus' compassion, we are sent to sin no more and to live in God's love and peace.

Regarding the hypocrisy of the Scribes and Pharisees, who were eager to condemn her. Jesus disarms their violent scapegoating intentions by challenging them to cast the first stone if they are without sin. Jesus disempowers the scapegoating mob. May human sinful misery meet the mercy of God in our secular and sacred spaces, to the glory of God and salvation of souls.

**FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT, YEAR C
April 6, 2025**

Introduction:

The story from the Fifth Sunday of Lent, Year C, teaches us about mercy, forgiveness and avoiding hypocrisy. Jesus shows compassion to the woman, encouraging her to leave her life of sin without condemning her.

First Reading - Isaiah 43:16-21

The Lord God is doing something new for his people.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 126:1-6

A song is praise of the Lord's marvelous deeds.

Second Reading-Philippians 3:8-14

Paul says he counts all things as loss and focuses on one goal, Jesus Christ.

Gospel - John 8: 1-11

Jesus does not condemn the woman caught in adultery. He responded wisely, suggesting only a sinless person should cast the first stone. He chose not to condemn her advising her to abandon her sinful life.

Questions for Reflection

1. What new beginnings is God offering you in your life?
2. How can you let go of past mistakes and focus on the future?
3. What can you learn from Jesus' trust in the goodness of the crowd?
