

From the Pastoral Administrator's Desk

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER-DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY YEAR C - April 27, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

Grace and peace of our Lord, Jesus Christ be with you! Today's Gospel reading combines two scenes: Jesus' appearance to his disciples after his Resurrection and Jesus' dialogue with Thomas. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus also commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun. As Jesus was sent by God, so too does Jesus send his disciples. The continuity with Jesus' own mission is an essential element of the Church. Jesus grants the means to accomplish this mission when he gives his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit binds us together as a community of faith and strengthens us to bear witness to Jesus' Resurrection.

Thomas, the disciple who doubts, represents the reality of the Church that comes after this first community of disciples. All but the first disciples of Jesus must believe without seeing. Like Thomas, we may doubt the news that Jesus, who was crucified and buried, appeared to his disciples. It is part of our human nature to seek hard evidence that the Jesus who appeared to the disciples after his death is, indeed, the same Jesus who was crucified. Thomas is given the opportunity to be our representative who obtains this evidence. He gives witness to us that the Jesus who was raised is the same Jesus who had died. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are among those who are blessed for we have not seen and yet have believed.

The Divine Mercy Sunday origin is from a revelation to Saint Faustina, a Sister of Mercy in Poland who initiated the Divine Mercy devotion. Between 1930 and 1938 Jesus requested numerous times a Feast of Divine Mercy. On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of Saint Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

One of the most significant Eucharist hymns is composed by another Thomas, St. Thomas Aquinas, it is "Adoro te Devote." In this hymn St. Thomas Aquinas proclaims "I adore you devoutly, hiding truth." May we continue to adore humbly and devoutly our hidden God, truly present in the Eucharist.

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER - APRIL 27, 2025

Introduction:

Today is the Sunday of Divine Mercy. In his second encyclical, "Dives in Misericordia" (Rich in Mercy), Pope Saint John Paul offers an extended meditation on the mystery of God's mercy, which he calls "the greatest of the attributes and perfections of God."

First Reading - Acts of the Apostles 5:12-16

Peter and the apostles performed many signs and wonders.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 118:2-4, 13-24

A song of praise to the Lord.

Second Reading - Revelations 1:9-11, 12-19

John describes the instructions he received to write down the vision.

Gospel - John 20:19-31

Thomas believes because he sees Jesus.

Questions for Reflection

- 1. What proof did Jesus give his disciples of his resurrection: Why would this be important to them?
- 2. What has convinced you of the reality of the risen Christ?
- 3. How would actually seeing Jesus helped your faith?
