

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER, YEAR C - May 18, 2025

Agape - Sacrificial Christian Love

Dear Parishioners,

Grace and peace of our risen Lord, Jesus Christ be with you!

There is a Christian Song that says "they will know we are Christians by our love." Jesus' new commandment to love one another as he has loved us, is a sacrificial kind of love. This agape love, unlike brotherly or sisterly love is selfless and rooted in a covenant relationship.

Jesus' emphasis that discipleship is shown through the kind of love which can transform hearts and demonstrate Christ to the world. He urges Christians to prioritize sacrificial love over political views or prestige, as this love is the true witness needed in our culture. We are encouraged to embody this kind of love in our daily interactions.

God being close to us means He is involved in our daily lives. He is not distant or far away but is always near, offering comfort and guidance. This presence can be a source of strength and hope, especially during difficult times.

Jesus is aware of his impending betrayal by Judas and the plots against him. Despite this, Jesus chooses to speak about love and service, showing His trust in the Heavenly Father and Creator.

In the reading from Acts of the Apostles, Paul and Barnabas encourage the early Church to remain strong in their faith. They show us the importance of community and support in the face of hardships, they continue to spread the Gospel, teaching us that faith and perseverance go hand in hand.

The passage from Revelation offers hope with the vision of a new heaven and a new earth. It reminds us that God is with us wiping away our tears and promising a future free of pain and suffering. The vision encourages us to hold on to our faith knowing that God is always near.

May God help us to sincerely love one another as Jesus taught us and give us strength to support each other in our faith journey and trust in divine providence.

Whole Community Catechesis Readings and Questions for Discussion FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER, YEAR C - MAY 18, 2025

Introduction:

The Fifth Sunday of Easter, Year C. focuses on the growth of the early Church and Jesus' command to love one another. Today's reading highlight the importance of faith community and the promises of a new heaven and earth.

First Reading - Acts of the Apostles 14:21-27

Spreading the Good News

Paul and Barnabas revisited cities, encouraging disciples and explaining hardship in God's Kingdom. They appoint church leaders entrusted to the Lord and shared their mission success in Antioch emphasizing God's outreaching to non-Jews.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 145

The Lord's compassion and mercy extends to all, slow to anger and full of love.

Second Reading - Revelations 21:1-5a

John describes a new heaven and earth. He sees a splendid New Jerusalem and hears God proclaim His eternal dwelling with people, erasing all pain and making everything new.

Gospel - John 13:31-35

Love One Another

Jesus spoke of his imminent glorification, intertwining his honor with God's. He shared a new commandment with his disciples to love one another as he loved them. The mutual love among his followers would be the defining mark of his discipleship.

Question for Reflection

- 1. How did the early Church support each other and how can we do the same today?
- 2. What does Jesus' command to love one another, mean to you personally?
- 3. In what ways do you feel God's presence in your daily life?
