

#### From the Pastoral Administrator's Desk

## SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER, YEAR C - June 1, 2025 IN JESUS CHRIST, WE ARE ONE

Dear Parishioners,

Grace and peace of our risen and ascended Lord, Jesus Christ be with you!

This weekend before celebrating the Ascension and Pentecost, we reread the message of the last supper, in which we must see diverse ways of presenting a single message, since everything springs from the union of being attached to the Vine, Jesus, like the branches (mystical body of Christ).

In today's Gospel passage, taken from Jesus' high priestly prayer, Jesus prays in particular for those disciples who are sharing a meal with him. The core of Jesus' message is love, a love that is manifested not in nice-sounding words but more convincingly, in the genuine acts of love that will bind his disciples together into one community. The world cannot be evangelized by competing churches, and this is why Jesus prayed that his disciples might be as fully one as he and the Father are one.

We live in a world of confusion, misinformation and disinformation, a time of discordance in the message of the gospel. While the Word of God remain eternally immutable and is carefully preserved, protected, taught and witnessed to by the Catholic Church, many separated brethren from other ecclesial communities and even with the Catholic Church have clinged to spurious and personal interpretations of the gospel, making false claims and false teachings, all in God's name thereby tearing the unity and oneness that Christ's message impacts. The Gospel message can be twisted and turn upside down for selfish reason. Had the Apostles disagreed in their message and witnessing, we would not have had reason to believe that their message and testimonies were true.

Let us continue to pray fervently that God may show us the right way to proceed in achieving true and lasting Christian unity without sacrificing the basic Christian principles and teachings. We should also offer our personal prayers that the unity for which our Lord prayed may be brought nearer.

May God bless us with Christian love that results in Christian unity.

#### SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER, YEAR C - June 1, 2025 Faith, Unity and the Promise of Eternal Life

#### Introduction:

The Seventh Sunday of Easter, Year C, focuses on unity, love and faith. The readings highlight the steadfastness of Stephen, the promises of Jesus, and the prayer for unity among believers. Jesus promises to return soon. Tis gives hope and reminds us to stay faithful.

#### First Reading - Acts of the Apostles 7:55-60

Witness of Stephen

Stephen filled with the Holy Spirit, saw Jesus in heaven. As he was stoned, he asked Jesus to receive his spirit and forgive his killers.

#### Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 97

The Psalmist declares, that, the Lord reigns with Justice, making the earth rejoice. All peoples see His glory, and all gods bow before the Lord who is exalted above all.

#### Second Reading - Revelation 22:12-17

Invitation to All

Jesus promises to come soon bringing rewards for each person based on their deeds. He invites all who are thirsty to come and receive life-giving Holy Spirit.

#### Gospel - John 17:20-26

**Eternal Life** 

Jesus prays for believers to be united as one, as He is with the Father. He wishes for them to see His glory and know the love of the Holy Trinity.
