

From the Pastoral Administrator's Desk**PENTECOST SUNDAY, YEAR C - June 8, 2025**

Dear Parishioners,

Grace and peace of our risen and ascended Lord, Jesus Christ be with you! Come Holy Spirit, Come.

Today at Mass, particularly at Holy Communion, the power of the Holy Spirit will come down upon us. Fiery tongues will not be seen, but invisible tongues of fire will not be absent. There was still another external manifestation of the Holy Spirit; the apostles and disciples were enabled to speak various languages.

Pentecost is the complement and the completion of Easter. Easter gives us the beginning of supernatural life and incorporation in Christ. But this new life must unfold; it must be strengthened and enkindled into a burning fire which can resist all things; it must be imbued with a love that is stronger than death, so that we are prepared to suffer all things for Christ, even the sacrifice of our life. The strengthening of our spirit is brought about by our baptism with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Pentecost is the birthday of the Church and of Christianity, the beginning of the new dispensation. The spirit of Pentecost is the spirit that makes the confessors and martyrs. It gives light, power, and unconquerable strength. This effect is visible in the apostles, who "went from the presence of the Council, rejoicing that they were accounted worthy to suffer reproach for the name of Jesus." (Acts 5:41) Man, having been touched by the spirit, no longer lives according to the flesh, according to the principles and ideals of fallen human nature; he lives in the spirit. He is filled with the light of truth and is guided by the spirit of truth Himself, the Holy Spirit.

This new regeneration, makes believers to now see all things in their proper place in the plan of divine providence and in their relationship to eternity. In the spirit of truth and love the new generation is called to act for good and upright motives, to do only what is pleasing to the Father of all humanity." The fruits of the spirit is charity, joy, peace, patience, benignity, goodness, longanimity, mildness, faith, modesty, continency, chastity." (Galatians 5:22)

The Feast of Pentecost is a day of thanksgiving for the foundation of the Church, in which are contained all the treasures of supernatural riches, and through which all graces and redemption are given to men. Pentecost is a day of thanksgiving for the coming of the Holy Spirit and the establishment of the Sacrament of Confirmation. It is a day of petition, a day on which we should implore the Holy Spirit for a full measure of His graces and gifts. With the Church we pray Come, Thou Holy Spirit, Come, renew the face of the earth.

Readings and Questions for Discussion

The Solemn Feast of Pentecost, Year C - June 8, 2025

Introduction:

The Solemnity of Pentecost (Whitsunday), ranks among the greatest feasts of Christianity. It commemorates not only the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, Mary, and the Disciples, but also the fruits and effects of that event: the completion of the work of redemption, the fullness of grace for the church and its members, and the gift of faith for all nations.

First Reading - Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

During Pentecost, the disciples, filled with the Holy Spirit, spoke in diverse languages, astonishing a multinational crowd in Jerusalem as each heard God's wonders in their own tongue.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 104

The Psalmist overwhelmed by God's wonders, His vast and varied creations, praised the Lord, rejoicing as He refreshes the earth with His life-giving spirit.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13

Declaring "Jesus is Lord" requires the Holy Spirit. Diverse spiritual gifts, services, and functions are from one spirit, uniting us in Christ's body, transcending all differences.

Gospel - John 20:19-23

In a locked room, Jesus appeared to his fearful disciples, offering peace. He showed his crucifixion wounds, turning their fear to Joy. Jesus then commissioned them, as the Father had sent him, and bestowed the Holy Spirit, granting them authority to forgive or retain sins.

Question for Reflection

1. What unique gifts has the Holy Spirit given to you to share with others?
2. How can we celebrate the diversity within our church community and the world?
3. How can we use our unique talents to build up the church and our communities?
