

Love God and Love Your Neighbor

Dear Parishioners,

Grace and peace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with you! The great commandment: love of God and neighbor reminds us that these are the foundation of all rules and actions. Rules are not just tasks to complete but ways to show love for God, others, and ourselves.

The Bible explains that simple daily actions, like helping at home, in Church, or going to Mass, are opportunities to live out love. By putting love at the center, we move beyond following rules and start living with purpose. Today's readings, especially the Gospel, teaches that true faith begins with sincere, sacrificial love.

The parable of the Good Samaritan reveals God's mercy, as Jesus Himself came to save us when we were broken and helpless in sin. Jesus heals our wounds, pays the price for us, and entrusts us to His Church. Christ reminds us that we are to love others as he has loved us. In other words, as we have been loved by God. This unconditional and limitless love leads us to eternal life.

Today's readings show us how love for God and love for others cannot be separated. The parable of the Good Samaritan challenges us to act with compassion, even when it is not easy. In this story, Jesus shows that the heart of God's law is love. Loving God and loving others go hand in hand. Following the law is not about looking good or avoiding others who seem unclean. It is about becoming the kind of people who care for those around us. Let us strive to love our neighbors (others), and act with kindness, no matter who they are.

Whole Community Catechesis Readings and Questions for Discussion

Sunday, July 13, 2025 Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C

Introduction:

Today's readings encourage faith in action, mercy and kindness for others, and seeing Christ as the center of all creation. In the story of the Good Samaritan, Jesus calls us to serve others with kindness, care and compassion.

First Reading - Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Obeying God's Word.

Moses told the people that God's commandments are not beyond their reach.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 69

The Psalmist affirms that God hears the cry of the poor and will save Zion.

or Psalm 19

The Lord's perfect law refreshes the soul, gives wisdom, brings joy, and enlightens the eyes. God's words are precious, true, just, and sweeter than honey.

Second Reading - Colossians 1:15-20

Christ at the Center.

Christ shows us God created everything, holds everything together, leads the Church, and reconciles all things through His death on the cross, and resurrection.

Gospel - Luke 10:25-37

Love Your Neighbor.

A scholar asked Jesus how to inherit eternal life and who is a neighbor? Jesus tells a parable to answer a challenge. In the parable, the Good Samaritan does what others do not - he stops to care for someone who is suffering, he sees a need and responds with kindness.

Question for Reflection

- 1. What does the Parable of the Good Samaritan teach us about caring for others?
- 2. Who are the "neighbors" you find it hardest to love?
- 3. What small steps can you take to be a better neighbor to those around you?
