

From the Pastoral Administrator's Desk

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time- Year C August 3, 2025

What Really Matters to God?

Dear Parishioners,

Grace and peace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with you!
In our modern consumerist world, we are constantly bombarded by marketing wizards on TV, the internet and social media. They dangle before us the products we allegedly need to make our lives complete. The end result is that we never quite feel that we have enough.

What really matters to God? Jesus answers that question through his life and teachings: Love God and neighbor with compassion, render humble service for others, forgive, promote justice and peace, trust in God's providence, to name a few. May Jesus help us to become rich in those things that matter to God.

Do we listen carefully to the voice of the Lord? Do we set our hearts on what will live forever? How many people fool themselves and believe that their material possessions will bring happiness and fulness of life? Are we growing "rich in the sight of the Lord?"

Today's readings challenge us with another question: What are we living for? What really matters in life? It is only in our relationship with Jesus that we can discover our true self - the person of value that Jesus calls us to be.

The Gospel reading of Luke gives us two stories about people who base their security on wealth. In the story of the rich young man in Luke 18, and in Luke 12, the rich person from today's Gospel, Jesus points out their possessiveness and their lack of concern for the needy. In contrast, Jesus calls all of us to trust not in our possessions but in God's providence.

Jesus is not condemning wealth or those who work hard to provide for their families. The key point of today's parable is his introduction, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." And he concludes with this teaching: "Thus it will be for all who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

Notice what Paul says in the second reading from his Letter to the Colossians. "Brothers and Sisters: If you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth."

As Catholic Christian believers, it is only in our relationship with Jesus that we can discover our true self - the person of value that Jesus calls us to be.

Whole Community Catechesis Readings and Questions for Discussion

The Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C Sunday, August 3, 2025

Introduction:

The Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C, reminds us to stop and think about what really matters most beyond money, success, things, fame - eternal treasures.

The readings focus on the dangers of greed and the importance of storing up eternal treasures in heaven.

First Reading - Ecclesiastes 1:2, 2:21-23

The Emptiness of Wealth.

This reading explores the futility of worldly possessions and labor without a deeper purpose emphasizing the vanity of seeking fulfillment solely in material wealth.

Value your time and days on earth.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 90

Psalm 90 teaches us to ask God to help us use our time well. We are reminded that each day is a gift. Time is valuable and precious.

Second Reading - Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11

Setting Our Hearts on Heavenly Treasures.

This passage encourages believers to seek heavenly things and to put off the old self, focusing on the new life found in Christ.

Gospel - Luke 12:13-21

Trusting in God, Share Your Blessings.

The Gospel reading features the parable of the rich fool, highlighting the dangers of greed and the importance of investing in eternal rather than earthly riches.

Question for Reflection

- 1. What is one way you could focus more on eternal values this week?
- 2. How does greed or selfishness affect your relationship with God and others?
- 3. What blessings or joys have you received that go beyond material wealth?
