

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time-Year C

August 17, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

Grace and peace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with you!

In today's gospel, Jesus was thinking globally. He didn't want one person to be lost to the power of sin. but just for today, consider how his anguished heart was focused on you that day. Jesus knew that his suffering and death - and his resurrection - would restore you to a right relationship with God.

Jesus knew that his triumph or victory over death and sin would liberate those in bondage. The results of Jesus' resurrection are still flowing today. This means that even today, you can experience more of all that Jesus so longed to give you - more mercy, more grace, more compassion, more love, more freedom, more salvation.

Will you allow Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection to move you to seek him out? Believe that as you receive his forgiveness and experience the joy of worshipping him, you are doing more than just reaping the fruit of his sufferings. You are bringing joy and consolation to Jesus' anguished Sacred Heart.

Today's Gospel also reminds us that following Christ is not always easy; choosing sides rarely is. Which side are you on? Are you prepared to be countercultural, even radical? Are you willing to choose the most radical way of all, the way of loving and serving God and others as Christ did?



Whole Community Catechesis Readings and Questions for Discussion

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C Sunday, August 17, 2025

Introduction:

The readings for the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C, highlight the challenges of living out the faith. They show how faith can bring division, suffering and the need for perseverance.

First Reading - Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10

The Role of Prophets.

Jeremiah is punished for criticizing the wealthy for their corruption and their injustice to the poor.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 40:2-4, 18

A prayer for God's help and deliverance.

Second Reading - Hebrews 12:1-4

Perseverance in Suffering.

Let us persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus.

Gospel - Luke 12:49-53

Cost of Discipleship.

Jesus has come not only to bring peace but also division. Families will be divided because of him, with conflicts even among close relatives.

- 1. Do you love telling the truth more than telling lies?
- 2. Who is your favorite saint in heaven?
- 3. How does taking a stand for Jesus and his gospel create tension and division among close relatives?
