

From the Pastoral Administrator's Desk

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time- Year C August 24, 2025

GOD IN THE MOST ORDINARY PLACES.

Dear Parishioners.

Grace and peace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with you!

Where have you been surprised by God's presence? How can you live more aware of Him?

Perhaps, it's easy to be unaware to miss wonders right in front of us. This was Jacob's experience as he journeyed to Harran. (Genesis 28:10) He stopped and set up camp in a simple spot that seemed like any other, just a place to lay his head for the night. God appeared to him in a midnight dream, however, telling him that his numerous descendants would bless "all peoples on earth." He also assured Jacob that he would "watch over him wherever he would go" (v. 15). When he awoke, Jacob said, "Surely the Lord is in this place, and I was not aware of it." God is everywhere "filling heaven and earth" (Jeremiah 23:24). He is present in the sacred places and also in the most ordinary places. Our invitation is to keep our eyes, ears, and hearts open, to watch and listen for divine revelation.

The Gospel emphasizes the importance of striving to enter through the "narrow gate" which represents Jesus as the way to salvation. The Gospel does not answer how many will be saved, it urges us to act urgently to follow Jesus' path. Gods' plan includes gathering people from all nations to worship in the heavenly Jerusalem. However, those who refuse Jesus' way may miss out on the heavenly banquet God is encouraging us to persevere through hardships, knowing they are part of God's discipline for his beloved children seeking salvation.

Whole Community Catechesis Readings and Questions for Discussion

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C Sunday, August 24, 2025

Introduction:

The readings for the Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C, emphasize God's call to all people, no matter where they come from. This shows that God desires a diverse and inclusive family of God's people, He does not limit his love to one group. He invites everyone to know him.

First Reading - Isaiah 66:18-21

Universal Call.

The Lord gathers people from all nations to see his glory and spread it.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 117

Praise the Lord, all nations. His kindness is steadfast, and his faithfulness last forever.

Second Reading - Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

Discipline and Growth.

God disciplines those he loves. Endure trials as discipline, they will later bring righteousness and healing.

Gospel - Luke 13:22-30

Humility and Effort.

Jesus teaches that many will try to enter through the narrow gate but fail. He warns that some who are last will be first, and some who are first will be last.
