**A Note from Our Pastor,**

We begin the Holy Season of Lent this year this coming Wednesday March 5th. On Ash Wednesday Masses will be at 9am, 1pm and 7pm in the Upper Church. There will also be a 4pm Service with the Liturgy of the Word and distribution of ashes. Reconciliation will be available from 5:30–6:30 pm in the Lower Church. Please note that there will be NO Adoration on Wednesday evening this week as we will be celebrating Mass in the Upper Church.

Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat for all Catholics age 14 and above, meaning that no meat is to be eaten on those days. Ash Wednesday, as well as Good Friday, is also a day of fasting for all those between the ages of 18 and 59, (unless exempt due to a medical reason) meaning that we eat only one full meal that day, with two other smaller meals allowed, but taken together not equaling a full meal.

Please pick up a copy of our Lenten daily prayer booklets this year: Lent 2025 The Peaceful Path of Hope by Alice Camille. For the youngsters among us we also have a booklet entitled: A Journey through Lent with Jesus. Be sure to take one of each home with you—one per household. You'll also note that we have Rice Bowls available at our Church entryways. These are great for the Lenten practice of almsgiving. The money you place in the Rice Bowls during Lent can be donated directly to Catholic Relief Services by going on the website whose address you can find on the Rice Bowl itself. As most of you are well aware, CRS does amazing work in its outreach to the poor and those who are victims of natural disasters throughout the world.

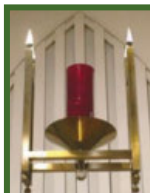

Pastoral Planning**March 2 ~ Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Today's Gospel offers much to ponder as we move toward the start of Lent. First Jesus says, "Remove the wooden beam from your eye first, then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's [sister's] eye." Then he says, "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit." Both sayings remind us of our need to reflect on our personal blind spots, behaviors or attitudes that demean others rather than build up others. If we take time to thoughtfully consider Jesus' teaching in this gospel, we may realize our need for God's healing in the Sacrament of Penance, especially before Lent starts. With God's grace and our effort to remove the "wooden beam in our own eye" will lead to our bearing "good fruit" during our Lenten journey!

This series is filmed on location in the Holy Land with preaching from Fr. Dave Pivonka, current president of Steubenville University, as well as personal testimonies from men and women,

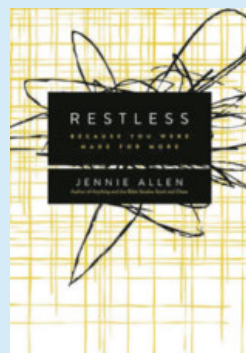

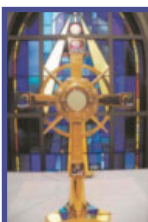


Project Rachel Post-Abortion Healing Retreats (March 15, May 10)

Music Ministry Notes

Liturgical Notes for Lent

To mark the season of Lent, there will be a few liturgical and musical changes to our weekend Masses:

- If the presider chooses to recite the penitential act in its first form, commonly known as the Confiteor (from the original Latin) you can find it on the very first page of the *Gather* hymnal, where it begins, “I confess to almighty God...”
- Following the Confiteor will be the *Kýrie, eléison* (“Lord, have mercy.”) It is a short chant we will repeat after the Cantor:
*Kýrie, eléison. Christe, eléison. Kýrie, eléison.
Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy.
Lord, have mercy.*
- The Glory to God is not sung or recited during Lent.
- Since the Alleluia is not sung during Lent, our Gospel acclamation will be “Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, King of endless glory.”
- We will chant the Eucharistic Acclamations (Holy, holy, etc.) and sing the Lamb of God in Latin:
*Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccáta mundi,
miserére nobis. (sing twice)
Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the
world, have mercy on us.
Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccáta mundi,
dona nobis pacem.
Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the
world, grant us peace.*
- There will be an instrumental recessional in place of a final hymn.

Lent is a unique season and an opportunity to draw ever closer to the Lord. May these liturgical changes serve as an invitation to enter more fully into the Lenten mysteries, and help us truly to prepare for the celebrations of the Paschal mystery this Holy Week and Easter.

On another note, our parish Youth Choir is participating in the American Federation Pueri Cantores Youth Choir Festival and Mass to be held at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross (1400 Washington Street in Boston) on **Saturday, March 8**. The Festival brings together Catholic Youth Choirs from around New England. Choirs have prepared all the Festival music ahead of time, then will be coming together to rehearse together all day. The Festival culminates in the Festival Mass at the Cathedral, 4:30pm and will be celebrated by Bishop Robert P. Reed. Parishioners are warmly invited to support our Youth Choir singers by attending this special Mass at the Cathedral.
