Reading II: 2 Timothy 1:6–8, 13–14

Beloved:

I remind you, to stir into flame the gift of God that you have through the imposition of my hands.

For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control. So do not be ashamed of your testimony to our Lord, nor of me, a prisoner for his sake; but bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God.

Take as your norm the sound words that you heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. Guard this rich trust with the help of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us.

Pastoral Planning**October 5 ~ Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time**

In today's second reading, St. Paul reminds us of our responsibility as disciples saying, "Stir into a flame the gift of God that you have..." We may feel inadequate or ill equipped to speak to another person about our faith or its importance in our lives, but St. Paul encourages us further with these words, "God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love..." Even when Jesus' own disciples were worried about their ability to carry out his mission, they turned to him asking for an increase of faith. How about us? Are we willing to share with courage the importance of our relationship with God?

Eucharistic Ministry for the Homebound

Are you or a family member or friend unable to attend Mass, but would like to receive a visit from a Eucharistic Minister to receive Holy Communion? If so, please call the Rectory (at 617-698-2439) and someone will contact you!

If you are bringing communion to someone, please let the celebrant know prior to Mass.

When you receive communion from the celebrant, bring your pyx so they may place communion in the minister's pyx for you.

Please remember, per Canon Law, Eucharistic Ministers are to take the Blessed Sacrament directly from the church, in a pyx or small ciborium, to the person who is to receive Communion. The Sacrament must never be taken home overnight to be distributed the next day. The extraordinary minister should consume consecrated hosts that cannot be distributed that same day.


