**“Not as man sees does God see...”**

Among recurring themes in St. John’s Gospel is the contrast between light and darkness, and between blindness and sight. The realities are related: in order to see accurately, one needs light; but much depends on the health of one’s eyes. As I write this reflection, I am scheduled for surgery late in the week, to remove a cataract from my left eye, so I am extra-sensitive to today’s Gospel imagery: I hope that by the weekend I will see with greater perception than has been increasingly the case. If all goes well, surgery on my right eye will take place April 3. As the condition has grown acute, I notice that I can be quite certain that I am seeing things accurately, although I often discover that I am, in fact, *not* perceiving things as they truly are. St. John points out repeatedly not just the vulnerability of our eyes, but the weaknesses in our *vision*. In today’s account of Jesus’ encounter with “*a man blind from birth*”, John’s focus is clear: Jesus heals the man’s physical blindness, but uses the occasion to teach an important lesson about differences of *vision*. Jesus reminds us that even when we ‘see’ what is *real* in terms of objective data, we may miss the true *meaning* of what we ‘see’. The episode is about a man who is given the ability to see with his physical eyes, but also about the many who may possess the gift of physical sight, but do not ‘see’ the truth about Jesus. Even many with ‘*sight*’ sharpened by long study of the Scriptures failed to ‘see’ in Jesus the fulfillment of all they were ‘*looking for*’. It is *vision guided by faith* that penetrates beyond the physical attributes of Jesus, to ‘see’ in Him the One in Whom “*the works of God*” are “*made visible*.” Just as Samuel needed God’s grace to identify David, Jesse’s youngest son, as the one whom God had chosen to be king, so grace must assist our eyes to look past the ordinariness of Jesus in His human person, to see Him as truly the Son of God. And, as is said, “There are none so blind as those who refuse to see.” Let us ask God’s grace to help us always ‘see’ Jesus as our loving Savior.

This season we hear a harsh tone, in John’s references to the Temple and Pharisee leaders as “*the Jews*”, that should be tempered in our reading of the Gospel and its narrative about Jesus’ Passion and Death. John lived for long years after the painful experience of witnessing those events—long enough for his personal feelings about the agents of Jesus’ betrayal and Crucifixion to harden, along with a growing antagonism between Jesus’ followers and those who saw Him as a threat to the Covenant tradition—an animus that deepened over time, into resentment that tragically has given rise to lamentable outbursts of violence against Jewish people and institutions, and even to their being justified as ‘God’s will.’ Jesus did challenge His opponents’ motives, but He neither desires, nor is honored by, anti-Semitic words, actions or attitudes. May such feelings never distort our understanding of Christ and His saving message.

PASTORAL VISITATION SCHEDULED – Come and Be Heard

Union County Regional Bishop Elias R. Lorenzo, O.S.B., will conduct a Pastoral Visitation of St. Michael Parish, March 31—April 2, 2023. Archdiocesan policy requires a Pastoral Visitation periodically, and especially when there is a transition between pastorates. As Msgr. Shugrue's extended term as Pastor is set to conclude on June 30, 2023, the Pastoral Visitation will be a significant part of the process for the naming of a new Pastor for St. Michael Parish. Bishop Lorenzo will collect information, from the Parish Staff and others, about the Parish and its ministries, and he wishes to hear from parishioners about your concerns and thoughts about the needs and direction of St. Michael Parish going forward. The Bishop will add the results of the Parish Visitation to the process whereby a new Pastor for St. Michael's will be appointed by Cardinal Tobin. There will be two opportunities for parishioners to meet with the Bishop in "Town Hall"-type settings: on Saturday, April 1, beginning at 7:30 PM; and again on Sunday, April 2, beginning at 2:00 PM. The sessions will be conducted in the Sarah Black Room of the Parish Center (handicapped-accessible by the elevator entrance off the Mary Garden). All are welcome and encouraged to participate. PLEASE NOTE:

The Church's Order of Penance has been revised, mostly regarding slight changes in the English translation of the formula for absolution: most penitents may not notice the changes in the wording used by the priest. There are no substantive changes in the format of the Sacrament or in the penitent's prayers, except for a concluding phrase after the priest pronounces absolution: the priest says, "Give thanks to the Lord for He is good", and the penitent replies "For His mercy endures forever." (A leaflet is being provided to assist penitents in adapting to the revised Rite) The revised Rite was approved for use as of Ash Wednesday, and must be used beginning **April 16, 2023**. Questions may be addressed to the priest at the time of Confession.
