Parents must register by calling the Rectory at least one month in advance. Baptism Instruction held the week before the Baptism. Proposed godparent/s need to be living in accordance to the teachings of the Catholic Church and received the Sacrament of Confirmation, and are asked to attend the Baptism Instruction along with the child's parents.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

The couple should contact a parish priest or deacon one year before the desired date for the marriage to ensure proper preparation for the Sacrament. Couples are not to make FIRM plans for the reception PRIOR to speaking with a parish priest or deacon.

SACRAMENTS FOR THE SICK/HOMEBOUND:

Anointing of the Sick: Anytime upon request in the home of the sick. If the infirm person is in hospital, please ask nurse to contact the Hospital Chaplain first.

Holy Communion: A Priest, Deacon or Eucharistic Minister of the parish will bring Holy Communion to those parishioners confined to their home. Please notify the Rectory when someone is ill. Most area hospitals have full-time priest-chaplains, who can be contacted via the nurses.

A Word from our Pastor ...

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

LENTEN SEASON BECKONS - The Holy Season of Lent will begin this week, as the Church observes **Ash Wednesday**. This is a day when Catholics “come out of the woodwork,” especially those who for some reason or another have moved away from the Church but are now discovering the richness and the beauty of life within the Christian community. For this reason, **several Masses will be celebrated on Wednesday at St. Peter's: 8:30am, 12Noon, 3:30pm, 6:00pm, 7:00pm in Vietnamese (Convent) and 7:30pm in Spanish.**

In the coming days and weeks, we are all encouraged to seek ways to beef up our spiritual life. On our parish website, for example, we have a section called “Nearby Events” which lists opportunities for spiritual growth being offered at nearby parishes. In the meantime, we encourage you to consider the following:

- Make sure to attend **Sunday Mass** every Sunday this Lent, no matter what other commitments come your way (yes, every Sunday!)
- Consider attending **daily Mass or one of the devotions** (such as the Friday Stations of the Cross, Monthly Holy Hour, Children's Holy Hour ...).
- Familiarize yourself with the Church's guidelines on **Fasting and Abstinence** (*found on Page Six of this bulletin*). Even though fasting is mandated only on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, we are still called to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent (and since all Fridays of the year are considered Days of Penance, many people practice abstinence from meat every Friday of the year – a very commendable practice).
- It is written in Scripture, “Store up **almsgiving** in your treasury, and it will save you from every evil. it will fight for you against the enemy” (*Sirach 29, 12*). Think of some cause (or causes) that you wish assist through your means this Lent. We might want to consider the Annual Appeal of the Archdiocese (which kicked-off this week, and which is helping a myriad of Church ministries that benefit primarily the least of God's people).



VISITATION BY BISHOP CRUZ – On Monday we were happy to have Bishop Manuel A. Cruz back among us, as he completed a Parish Visitation at St. Peter's. His day included an extended visitation to St. Peter's School. He met all the students and teachers by visiting every classroom and also met with the School Principal. Bishop Cruz – the Regional Bishop for Essex County – was thrilled by what he saw, especially by the “family spirit” he witnessed and the respectfulness of the students.

Bishop Manny also had a long meeting with the members of the Parish Finance and Pastoral Councils. He showed a real interest in each of the members present and listened to their recommendations for the future of the parish. It was a real moment of communion. This spilled-over in the celebration of Holy Mass in the evening, which concluded with a sumptuous reception that parishioners graciously put together.



We are now in the process of presenting a final report about the visit, which will include the suggestions and comments that parishioners shared with the bishop over the two days of the Parish Visitation. This was a moment of grace for our parish, and I wish to thank Bishop Manny for the vitality and enthusiasm that he shared with us.

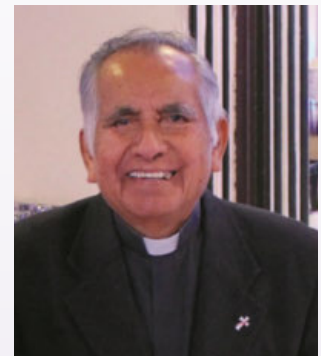
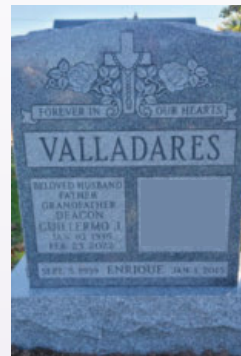

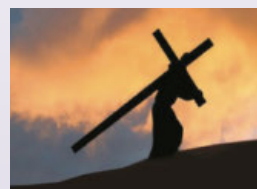

POPE AT GENERAL AUDIENCE: PROCLAIM THE GOSPEL AS LAMBS, NOT WOLVES

Dear brothers and sisters, we continue our catechesis - "The passion of evangelizing, apostolic zeal." The whole person is involved with this proclamation of the Gospel, and for this reason we talk about the passion for evangelizing. After having seen in Jesus the model and the master of proclamation, we turn today to the first disciples, to what the disciples did. The Gospel says that Jesus "appointed twelve, to be with Him, and to be sent out to preach" (Mk 3:14). Two things: to be (stay) with Him and to send them to preach.

First of all, there is no going without staying: before sending the disciples on mission, Christ "calls them to Himself" (cf. Mt 10:1). The proclamation is born from the encounter with the Lord; every Christian activity, especially the mission, begins from there. Witnessing Him, in fact, means radiating Him; but, if we do not receive His light, we will be extinguished; if we do not spend time with Him, we will bear ourselves instead of Him, and it will all be in vain. So only the person who remains with Him can bring the Gospel of Jesus. Someone who does not remain with Him cannot bear the Gospel. He will bring ideas, but not the Gospel.

Equally, however, there is no staying without going. In fact, following Christ is not an inward-looking fact: without a mission, the relationship with Jesus does not grow. We note that in the Gospel the Lord sends the disciples before having completed their preparation: shortly after having called them, He is already sending them! This means that the missionary experience is part of Christian formation.

Having called the disciples to Himself and before sending them, Christ addresses a discourse to them, known as the 'missionary discourse,' found in Chapter 10 of Matthew's Gospel and is like the 'constitution' of the proclamation. From that discourse, we can draw out three aspects: **why proclaim, what to proclaim and how to proclaim.**

Why proclaim? The motivation lies in a few words of Jesus, which it is good for us to remember: "Freely you have received, freely give" (v. 8). Why proclaim? Because I have received freely, and I should give freely. The proclamation does not begin from us, but from the beauty of what we have received for free, without merit: meeting Jesus, knowing Him, discovering that we are loved and saved. It is such a great gift that we cannot keep it to ourselves, we feel the need to spread it, in gratuitousness.

Second, then: **What to proclaim?** Jesus says: "Preach as you go, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.'" (v. 7). This is what must be said, first and foremost: God is near to His people. He said, "Look, what God is as close to the nations as I am to you?" This closeness is one of the most important things about God, along with His mercy and tenderness. This is the reality of God. We, in preaching, often urge people to do something, and that is fine; but let's not forget that the main message is that He is near. Accepting God's love is more difficult because we always want to be in the center as protagonists. We are more inclined to do than to let ourselves be molded; to speak than to listen. Instead, the proclamation must give primacy to God and to give to others the opportunity to welcome Him, to realize that He is near (with me in the background).

The third point: **how to proclaim?** It is significant to ask what should be the language for proclaiming. Jesus tells us that the manner - the style - is essential in witnessing. Witnessing does not just involve the mind and saying something (concepts). It involves the three languages of the person: thought, affection and work. He says "I send you out as sheep among wolves" (v. 16). He does not ask us to be able to face the wolves, that is, to be able to argue, to offer counter arguments, and to defend ourselves. We might think like this: let us become relevant, numerous, prestigious and the world will listen to us and respect us and we will defeat the wolves. No, I send you out as sheep, as lambs. If you don't want to be sheep, the Lord will not defend you from the wolves. Deal with it as best you can. But if you are sheep, rest assured that the Lord will defend you from the wolves. Be humble! He asks us to be like this: meek and with the will to be innocent (and willing to sacrifice). This is what the lamb represents: meekness, innocence, dedication and tenderness. And He, the Shepherd, will recognize His lambs and protect them from the wolves. On the other hand, wolves disguised as lambs are unmasked and torn to pieces. A Church Father wrote: 'As long as we are lambs, we will conquer, and even if we are surrounded by many wolves, we will overcome them. But if we become wolves we will be defeated, because we will be deprived of the shepherd's help. He does not shepherd wolves, but lambs' (*St. John Chrysostom, Homily 33 on the Gospel of Matthew*). If I want to be the Lord's, I have to allow Him to be my shepherd; and He is not the shepherd of wolves. He is the shepherd of meek, humble and kind lambs.

Still on the subject of how to proclaim, it is striking that Jesus, instead of prescribing what to bring on a mission, says what not to bring. The Lord makes you lighten your load. "Take no gold, nor silver, nor copper in your belts, no bag for your journey, nor two tunics, nor sandals, nor a staff" (vv. 9—10). He says not to lean on material certainties, but to go into the world without worldliness. That is to say, I am going into the world, not with the style of the world, not with the world's values, not with worldliness. For the Church, falling into worldliness is the worst thing that can happen. Rather, we proclaim by showing Jesus, rather than talking about Jesus. And how do we show Jesus? With our witness.

And finally, by going together, in community: the Lord sends all the disciples, but no one goes alone. The apostolic Church is completely missionary and in the mission it finds its unity. So, go forth, meek like lambs, without worldliness, and going together. Here is the key to the proclamation, this is the key to success in evangelization. Let us accept these invitations from Jesus!



After Sunday's prayer of the Angelus, Pope Francis expressed his sadness upon receiving news from Nicaragua. "I cannot but remember with concern Bishop Rolando Álvarez of Matagalpa (above), whom I care about greatly, sentenced to 26 years imprisonment, and also those who have been deported to the United States. I pray for them and for all those who are suffering in that dear nation, and I ask for your prayers," he concluded.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2023 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence. On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) **smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity**. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obligated to fast. On a day of Abstinence (Fridays) no meat, may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.
2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 26, 2023 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 4, 2023**

* Canon 921, 1. All faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

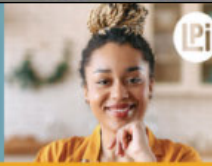
