### Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

We are given the ultimate moment of reflection on who we say we are and how our actions define us in the Gospel passage today. We see that our actions here on earth have eternal consequences. In today's Gospel, Jesus is talking to the disciples about what will happen when the Son of Man, who is Jesus himself, comes at the end of time. This passage comes toward the end of Jesus' ministry, shortly before he celebrates the Last Supper and is crucified. He is giving the disciples instructions about what will come next and what God is looking for in their life of discipleship. The path of discipleship is hard, but the consequences or effect of good discipleship is eternal life with God. As we have heard over the past several weeks, not everyone who claims to have faith in God actually reflects the faith in their actions. For example, there are Pharisees who say one thing about their faith but do something different. But we also know that there are disciples, at that time and today, who are honestly trying to find the way to holiness, even if they are not always successful. Jesus describes this beautiful moment when the Son of God comes in all grandeur and glory. This is his moment to separate those who are truly his disciples and those who are merely imposters. At the heart of this moment is that the sheep saw Jesus in everyone they encountered. They knew that to serve God meant to serve their neighbor. They took a chance to be hospitable and kind to everyone, no matter their status or how they could be repaid. These are the true disciples of Jesus. These are the ones that we are called to be like. It is important to remember that the motivation for our actions is as important as our actions. We show love and care for strangers because we love God and we are following Jesus. The effects f these actions raise up the poor, give witness to the Good News, and draw us closer to God.


