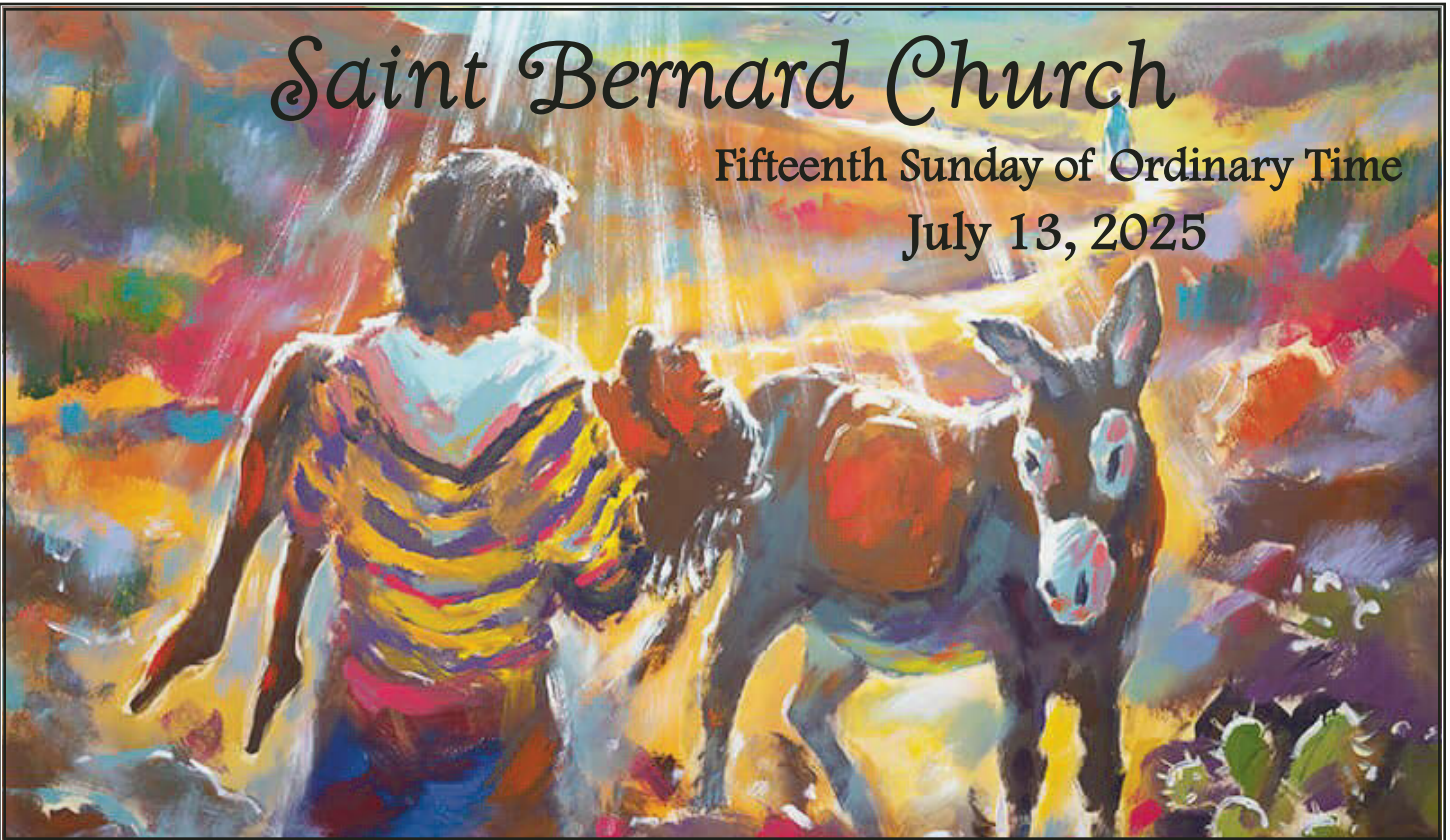

**Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word
Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

YOU HAVE ONLY TO CARRY IT OUT

This Sunday’s first reading from the Book of Deuteronomy is a very important one that we can easily overlook primarily because of the simplicity of the message. God’s commandments and statutes are not “too mysterious” or “remote” for us. We do not have to “go up to the sky” or “across the sea” to find God’s will. It is in fact “something “very near to (us).” These few notations from Deuteronomy lay false the claim that it is too difficult to attain to God’s will in our lives. While it is certainly true that there are times and circumstances that do require greater discernment in order to be in accord with the will of God, nevertheless the will of God has been revealed to us. We see His will in the life and teaching of the Lord; in Sacred Scripture; in the Commandments and the Beatitudes; in the teachings of the Church. Why then do so many have such a difficult time with the whole concept of God’s will? Why too, do people who claim to be doing the will of God come to completely contradictory conclusions? The answer is that we have too often discerned God’s will without relying on His two sources of self-revelation: Sacred Scripture (the Bible) and Sacred Tradition (the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit in the life and teachings of the Church). When these are omitted then discernment leaves vast room for self-deception where our ideas become God’s will. In the Gospel reading from St. Luke our Lord sums up the Commandments and all that flows from them with the two greatest, love of God and love of neighbor. Notice here how, in quoting Deuteronomy, our Lord is teaching us not just to love, but how to love; God with our whole heart, being, strength, and mind, and our neighbors as ourselves. This summary of God’s self-revelation, our Lord reminds us, is not “remote” but “very near.” Perhaps the reason why many men and women have difficulty with God’s will is because in some way we really do not want to always know it. To know God’s will, to know the Truth, means a conversion of life. Not many are quick to jump at that call. Yet the Lord God tells us that we “have only to carry it out.” Why is this so important? The responsorial psalm answers this by telling us that we “will live.” God has made us not to exist but to live. Those who carry out His will are the ones who are truly alive. At this year’s graduation Mass at St. Bernard Catholic Academy, I reminded the graduates of a truth of psychology that the more we think about ourselves the less happy we are. Conversely the more we think of others the happier we are. In others words we are made to be a people who care about each other. It is our God given nature. In the Gospel parable of the Good Samaritan, the priest and Levite go against their nature by ignoring the man who was victimized by robbers. The Samaritan lived up to his nature and cared for the injured man with mercy. The Lord then tells us to “go and do the same.” Whether it is keeping the Commandments, living by the Beatitudes, embracing the law of love, or fidelity to the teachings of Sacred Scripture and the Church, all of it comes together as something that is truly “near” to us. If we carry it out by God’s grace and with trust in His mercy as none of us is going to get this right all the time, we will in fact live the life God made us to live both now and forever.

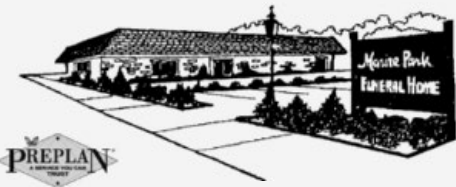
