


principal celebrant.

I wanted to give you all an update on just some of the projects and improvements we are working on.

CHURCH

Church kneelers. We have received a proposal from Sauder Company to repair and replace all the foam on the church kneelers. The cost is approximately \$26,000. Currently \$6,500 has been collected.

SCHOOL

Playground. We have begun fundraising for our new playground, still just shy of \$11,000 being put aside for this much needed upgrade. The total cost will be roughly **\$35-40,000**.




Lettering for Canterbury Corner: Due to age/damage the lettering for Canterbury Corner will need to be replace in the amount of \$3,700.






