



FROM THE DESK OF FATHER DAVID



In Yiddish they have a word for him. They call him a kvetch. Kvetch means a complainer; a whiner. Nobody likes a kvetch. There is a big difference between complaining and expressing concern. A complainer is looking to the past – to what has already happened. Frequently there is nothing that can be done about it. What's done is done. Complaints are usually self-focused. It's all about the complainer. He's been inconvenienced or feels disrespected; his advice has not been taken; he disagrees with a decision that has been taken; or things just haven't gone the way he would like them to go. Complainers frequently have lurking within themselves a passive-aggressive inclination, indirectly expressing their negative feelings instead of addressing them. They often wish to remain anony-

mous. But Jesus tells us what someone with such a complaint should do. "If your brother sins, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone." (Mt. 18:15) Jesus goes on to say if the he does not listen, only then approach him again with one or two others. Only then can one legitimately escalate the matter. Complainers like to kick things upstairs as soon as possible. Frequently they are reactive rather than responsive, and their reaction is often disproportionate to the situation.

In contrast to the complainer, someone who is legitimately concerned about a particular situation is looking to the future. How can this fault be remedied in the future? It's not personal. It's not about him. Rather than being self-focused, it is focused beyond himself. It's about the situation – which may or may not have an impact on others. A person who is truly concerned will be the first one to ask, "What can be done, and how can I help?"

Implicit within a complaint is a protest or outcry; annoyance and dissatisfaction. In contrast, someone who is concerned is someone who cares. Complaints are usually communicated with a negative tone and attitude. They frequently center on assigning blame and often sound angry. In contrast, concerns are usually communicated in a more controlled way – more calmly – although there may be overtones of anxiety.

Complainers often have made up their minds before hearing or even asking to hear the other side of the story. They've already concluded, "This is wrong!" They are not looking for a discussion or an explanation. Nowadays, one of the tactics of the complainer is a rush to social media, publicly exposing their targets to unnecessary and unconstructive ridicule. Those with a concern are more likely to be open to better understanding the situation before making up their minds.

Those expressing concerns directly to the person responsible are generally more interested in making things better for the future, rather than punishing people for the past. They are generally more likely to encounter people who are willing to be cooperative and willing to work towards a solution. Complainers are more likely to get a defensive response, making complaining counter productive if what you really are looking for is constructive improvement.

Let's admit it, we all complain from time to time. It's not pretty. And it is certainly unbecoming for a Christian to be a complainer. We need to honestly examine ourselves to see if our communications tend to be complaining or a genuine sharing of honest concerns. Do we tend to go to the person in the best position to make constructive changes at the lowest level, or do we jump at the first opportunity to escalate, breaking the "chain of command," as it were? Have we let our concerns become the matter of gossip?

Jesus calls us to love our enemies, let along those who merely annoy or disagree with us. We are called to be kind and patient with one another; to respond rather than to react; to be respectful of other people; and to leave our anger behind us before bringing our gifts to the altar.





ELIGIBILITY LETTERS FOR GODPARENTS AND SPONSORS


A person seeking a "sponsor letter" from OLMV to serve as a godparent for the Sacrament of Baptism or a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation must be an <u>active</u> registered parishioner of OLMV for at least 6 months and must have received all three Sacraments of Initiation, be active in the parish and, if married, be in a valid, Catholic marriage. An "active" Catholic is understood to be a person who attends Mass regularly and whose lifestyle is in keeping with the Catholic faith. He or she should ensure that his or her own school age children are attending Mass, are enrolled in religious education, and have received their sacraments.



In order to be considered a registered parishioner, an adult (persons 21 years of age or older) must submit a completed registration form. These forms can be picked up at the parish office. Completed forms must be brought to the parish in person. Please remind young adults (21 and older) who live with their parents, that they must be registered separately with the parish. Ordinarily, for Baptism, First Communion, Confirmation or Matrimony, or to receive a sponsorship eligibility certificate from this parish, a person must be a registered and active member of OLMV.

We are continuing to collect blessed palms from last year (or earlier years) for reverent disposal by burning.

Lenten Obligations

So that the Church of Metuchen may be spiritually one in a common observance of Lent, the following days of fast and abstinence are to be observed by all Catholics of the Diocese who enjoy the blessings of good health:

- 1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.
- 3. From the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday until the celebration of the Easter Vigil on the evening of Holy Saturday, the Easter fast should be observed so that, with uplifted and welcoming hearts, we may be ready to celebrate the joys of the Resurrection. This ancient tradition, intimately connected with the Rites of Holy Week and the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, is encouraged, especially in those places baptizing catechumens at the Easter Vigil.

The obligation to fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. To fast in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal during the day so as to experience hunger.

The obligation of abstinence affects all Catholics who have reached the age of 14. Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat.

The obligation of fast and abstinence, as a whole, is a serious obligation. While failure to observe any penitential day in itself may not be considered serious, the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of them without good cause, would be considered a grave matter. Those unable to abstain for a valid reason on any given Friday of Lent are asked to perform some other penitential act, or to abstain on another day.
