# From the Pastor's Desk

#### Dear Parishioners:

Thanksgiving is this Thursday, November 28th. I would like everyone to make an effort to come to Mass on Thanksgiving Day. **Mass will be at 10:00 AM.** While it is not a holy day, Thanksgiving Day is a wonderful opportunity as a parish family to come and thank God for all His tender mercies.

In addition, I would like to encourage people NOT to go shopping on Thanksgiving Day. I know a number of stores are now opening with sales, etc. I have two problems with stores opening on Thanksgiving Day. First, the employees at these stores are now required to be away from their families. They either arrive late or leave early from the family dinner to get to work. We owe it to them to allow them to have a peaceful Thanksgiving.

Secondly, as a society we need to have at least a day or two to simply be with our families. If you are 55 or older, you may recall that we had the "Blue Laws." The "Blue Laws" restricted what businesses could be open on Sunday. As a result, Sunday really was a family day. I see a correlation between the weakening of family life and the removal of the "Blue Laws." Keep Thanksgiving a family day; don't let Thanksgiving Day become another "big sale" shopping day!

While President George Washington proclaimed the first national day of Thanksgiving, it took some time before Thanksgiving became a national holiday. In September 1863, Sarah Joseph, a newspaper editor, wrote to President Abraham Lincoln imploring him to set aside a national day of Thanksgiving. Up to that time, various states celebrated a day of Thanksgiving at various dates. Ms. Hale had made this request of other Presidents prior to Lincoln, but President Lincoln responded immediately.

President George Washington proclaimed:

It is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will and to be grateful for all His benefits and humbly to implore His protection and favor.

President Lincoln proclaimed:

I do, therefore, invite my fellow citizens... to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next as a day of Thanksgiving and praise to our beneficent Father who dwells in the heavens.

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.


# Thanksgiving Day

# Let's Share Our Christmas Joy!

As we prepare for Thanksgiving and begin gearing up for the Christmas, it is a happy, hectic time for most. But for those struggling financially, it can be a stark reminder of the heavy burden of economic hardship. It brings additional stress and feelings of deprivation. Thankfully, it is also a time when the generosity of St. Patrick parishioners is quite evident.

Our Parish Outreach Office coordinates three major projects to help those in need this time of year. The first is our Thanksgiving Basket program, where the makings of a Thanksgiving meal are prepared and delivered to those unable to afford a holiday meal. Second is our Reach for a Star program where parishioners take stars with gift requests written on them off Christmas trees placed in the church, purchase the gifts, and return them to the church. The gifts are then delivered to families in need just before Christmas. And finally, our Christmas Basket program provides the makings of a Christmas dinner to struggling families. It is all an enormous undertaking, but a much needed one.

Parish Outreach Director Dianne Williams and scores of volunteers help pull everything together, but Dianne is quick to send the credit back to St. Patrick parishioners.

"Our parishioners, enable us to assist many people who live within our parish boundaries and who have come upon difficult times for a variety of reasons. Unemployment, health issues, single parenthood, mental illness, aging issues, etc. can quickly send any family into a financial tailspin," Dianne said. "All those who enter our Outreach office are treated with dignity, respect, and most importantly, the assurance of their confidentiality. It is our privilege to serve the parishioners of St. Patrick's and experience the love of Christ in action."

The generosity of our parishioners also reaches beyond our parish boundaries. "There are many parishes within our diocese that have great needs and are not as blessed as we are in terms of donations," Dianne said. "Our resources are such that we are able to regularly share our bounty with other Outreach offices. Every food item, monetary gift or Christmas gift donated to our Parish Outreach will find its way to a family who needs it, even if it is a family outside of our parish."

This year Parish Outreach will be providing Thanksgiving baskets to approximately 80 families. Christmas Baskets are provided to approximately 90 families each year. Our Reach for a Star program has provided more than 2,500 gifts to those in need annually. As Dianne explains, "people try to manage on their own, but as the holiday approaches, they realize that they cannot provide a holiday meal for their family. It is then they will come to us seeking assistance. We are blessed to be able to provide for these families even at the last minute."

Next weekend our Reach for a Star program begins. Often the gift requests on the stars are very basic items such as clothing or even diapers. Many families with teenagers request gifts cards to facilitate clothing size issues and the specific tastes of their child. "I think we all know how difficult it can be to shop for a teen," Dianne said. Outreach also encourages families with children to request "fun items" or toys.

So to all those who have the resources to help again this year, please do so. And to all those who need a helping hand, please do not hesitate to contact our Parish Outreach office. We are, after all, your parish family.

December 1, 2024
First Sunday of Advent
Readings: Jeremiah 33: 14-16;
1 Thessalonians 3:12—4; 2: Luke 21: 25-28, 34-36

Jesus said to his disciples: "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on earth nations will be in dismay, perplexed by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will die of fright in anticipation of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. But when these signs begin to happen, stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand. "Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catch you by surprise like a trap. For that day will assault everyone who lives on the face of the earth. Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man."

# Thanksgiving Proclamation – excerpted [New York, 3 October 1789] by the President of the United States of America

The United States was blessed to be founded by many men and women of great faith. From the Declaration of Independence through the Constitution and Bill of Rights, the doctrine of natural rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, the primacy of the Judeo-Christian ethos, and the belief in a final judgement for each individual are evident. It would then be expected that this new nation would turn in Thanksgiving to God and ask President George Washington to proclaim:

"Whereas it is the duty of all Nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey his will, to be grateful for his benefits, and humbly to implore his protection and favor—and whereas both Houses of Congress have by their joint Committee requested me "to recommend to the People of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer

. . .

Now therefore I do recommend and assign Thursday the 26th day of November next to be devoted by the People of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being, who is the beneficent Author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be—That we may then all unite in rendering unto him our sincere and humble thanks—for his kind care and protection of the People of this country... for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed; ... and in general for all the great and various favors which he hath been pleased to confer upon us.

...and also that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations and beseech him to pardon our national and other transgressions—to enable us all, whether in public or private stations, to perform our several and relative duties properly and punctually—to render our national government a blessing to all the people, by constantly being a Government of wise, just, and constitutional laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obeyed...To promote the knowledge and practice of true religion and virtue, —and generally to grant unto all Mankind such a degree of temporal prosperity as he alone knows to be best.

Given under my hand at the City of New-York the third day of October in the year of our Lord 1789."




