FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners of Our Lady of Mercy:



Greetings in the name of Our Lord Jesus Christ!

This past Wednesday, Ash Wednesday, Lenten season has begun with the imposition of ashes and being reminded that “we came from dust and to dust we shall return.” All throughout the year, this particular season is the time when we are strongly urged to be mindful of our sinfulness and repent. Not that in other seasons of the church's calendar we are not asked to, but this the season of Lent we are asked particularly to ponder on the reason why Christ, Our Lord, came into our world, which is, to redeem and save us because of His great love for us. In this world, there is a lot of all kinds of temptations to sin. Even Jesus in the Gospel was tempted by the devil. We have the more reason to ask God's protection against temptations and really be with the Lord all the time. Let us try our best to listen to Him and change our bad ways into God's ways in order to be worthy of eternal life. Let the Responsorial Psalm be our prayer, “Be with me Lord, not only in time of trouble, but all the time!”

Starting this weekend, we also have another opportunity to know some of the ministries in our faith community. We will get to know more about what they are and hopefully the Holy Spirit will stir in us to be of service to others by volunteering to be part of it. The members of these ministries are there to give you

more information. This weekend the ministry we showcase is the Baptismal ministry. In my own personal view, we have a beautiful baptismal program. The program involves the following: we gather to rejoice with the family from the moment of conception, we gather to understand the first Sacrament of which the baby has to receive, that is, the Sacrament of Baptism, we gather to prepare for baptism (also known as the rehearsal), we gather to celebrate the Sacrament (that is, the actual baptism) and then we gather to remember the celebration of the Sacrament after few months (also known as a “reunion” with other families whose babies were baptized within a year. This is also a time when the family would like to share with us how the child is doing.) Check it out after each Mass today.

A LENTEN REFLECTION CHECKING YOUR THINKING!

AS YOU THINK was the name of a Catholic Radio Program that used to be on WABC radio some years ago. When I first heard the title of that radio show, I did not understand what it meant. It was only when I discovered the entire saying from which those three words were taken that I understood the reason that name was given the program. The entire quotation goes **AS YOU THINK, SO SHALL YOU BECOME.**

That quotation expresses the belief that our thoughts determine the kind of person we become. Our thoughts shape and mold us, they affect our behavior.

For example, if a person thinks of himself as a failure and a loser, he will most likely fail. If a person thinks of herself as being creative and successful, that person will most likely succeed.

That also happens when we go to a party. If we walk into a party thinking we will have a miserable time, we most likely will. If we enter the room where the party is taking place, with the expectation we will have a great time and meet new people, we probably will. **AS YOU THINK, SO SHALL YOU BECOME.**

We certainly can apply that saying to this season of Lent that began this past Ash Wednesday. During Lent we are called to examine our lives to see the areas of sin and darkness that need changing. We are told, "Repent, and believe in the Gospel."

We traditionally respond to that challenge of Lent by prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Certainly, three good things to do. But perhaps this Lent we might concentrate not so much on what we are doing, but on what we are thinking.

We might ask ourselves,

- Am I thinking like Jesus would think?
- Are the thoughts I have, the thoughts that Jesus would have?
- Are the hopes and dreams that occupy my mind in line with

the Gospel?

If the answer is NO, then we need to start changing our thinking. The odds are, if we start thinking like Jesus, if we start thinking good and holy thoughts, we will become better, holier Christians.

It is interesting that when we were marked with ashes this past Wednesday, those ashes were put on our foreheads, they were put on our "minds." Perhaps that is a sign that our minds, our thoughts, have to be in line with those of Jesus Christ, who is represented by the cross of ashes.

Even the traditional practices of Lent are related to our thoughts. When we pray, our thoughts are directed to God. When we give alms, we think not of our needs, but of the needs and wants of our neighbor whom we are called to love. When we fast, we try to be led by our Lenten thoughts and resolutions and not by our bodily desires.

This Lent, perhaps the best thing we can do is to make sure that our thoughts are Christ-like thoughts. The cross of ashes, placed on our foreheads at the start of Lent, proclaimed let your thoughts be those of Christ, for **AS YOU THINK, SO SHALL YOU BECOME.** © 2019 Rev. Thomas Iwanowski

UPDATE ON CAPITAL CAMPAIGN: "WE ARE LIVING STONES"

You may recall that the Case Items for Parish Portion are the following:

- Purchase and Installation of a gas generator
- Repointing of the Church
- Replacement of windows on the school's 3rd floor
- Repairing the boiler in the school (done)
- Debt reduction

As far as the school boiler repair is concerned, we have spent a total of \$41,675.00 for the three repairs we have done. This figure is disbursed from the Capital Campaign.

Pray, dear brothers and sisters, that there will be no more school boiler repairs in the near future.

As of present, we have reached 100.20% of our goal (\$499,149.00) of which \$400,948.52 has been collected and \$174,734.56 disbursed to parish.

Soon, we will be replacing the third floor school windows and the fund will be taken from the balance of WALs rebate.

I am gently reminding those who have not fully paid the pledge to continue sending your payment to WALs office.

QUESTIONS REGARDING PARISH ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT 2018

What does "Assistance from Archdiocese of Newark" mean?

It is the money that the Archdiocese takes from our school (Starting Point School) rental when we need help for repairs of more than \$25,000.00.

You see, this is how it works: Starting Point School sends their rent to the Archdiocese, not to us. The Archdiocese then deposits it to our account. If we need financial help for major repairs, the Archdiocese sends us what we need, taking it out from our account. In other words, it isn't subsidized by the Archdiocese. It is our money.

2019 LENTEN REGULATIONS

Lent is a time for prayer, fasting, and charity as we prepare to renew our baptismal promises at Easter. The practice of penance forms a necessary part of this preparation. The Church gives us the following regulations to help us make the season of Lent a particular time of penance and preparation for Easter.

1. Ash Wednesday (March 6) and Good Friday (April 19) are days of Fast and Abstinence.

2. All the Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

3. A Day of Fast means that only one full meal is permitted. Two smaller meals may be eaten. There is no food taken between meals. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast, though others are encouraged to fast. The days of fast are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

4. On a Day of Abstinence no meat may be eaten. Those 14 years of age and older are obliged to abstain from meat. For a serious reason, Church Law allows the pastor to dispense an individual from refraining from meat on a Friday during the Lenten Season.

5. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially" or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

6. Catholics should go to Holy Communion at least once between the First Sunday of Lent (March 10) and Trinity Sunday (June 16). If necessary, they should celebrate the Sacrament of Penance. Our Parish Communal Penance Service is Monday, April 1. Individual confessions are heard each Saturday afternoon at OLM from 3:30 to 4:30 pm in the church.

PARKING CONSIDERATION!

Dear Parishioners, I ask your assistance in resolving a potentially dangerous situation. As you know, parking is not permitted along Brother Stan Drive. The area has been marked again with new signage and the curb painted red. However, parishioners regularly park there for Mass. Emergency vehicles cannot make the turn from Lembeck on to Brother Stan Drive and up Pearsall. As you know, seconds are precious for response time in a life-threatening emergency. I ask you to be considerate and to respect the traffic laws. I realize that parking is limited and remind you to allow adequate time for parking in legally designated spaces when attending Mass. Arriving close to the start of Mass and finding a spot close to the Church is unlikely. In the next few weeks, cones will also be placed on Brother Stan Drive during Masses as yet another reminder not to park there. Please abide by the parking regulations so as not to potentially endanger the life and safety of your neighbors and to avoid a potential ticket or tow. Thank you for your attention.

IS YOUR MARRIAGE VALID?

If you were married civilly, that is, not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it might not be a valid marriage. Some couples believe that a marriage before a Justice of the Peace or a non-Catholic minister is valid. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.) We invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church.

Calling all moms who are expecting babies, please know that we have a team who takes care of celebrating your joy through a "Gathering To Rejoice!" The team is there to rejoice with you for the precious gift of your child and also will assist you towards baptism and beyond. BAPTISM MINISTRY AT OUR LADY OF MERCY PARISH



The baptism preparation at OLM is designed to help parents reflect on the gift of human life. Its primary purpose is not to prepare parents to celebrate the day when the waters of baptism will be poured over their child, but rather to help parents reflect on the meaning of their own baptism and the Catholic Faith they wish to share with their son or daughter.

Baptismal preparation at OLM is a trilogy of Gathering to Understand, Gathering to Prepare, and Gathering to Celebrate. It has a prequel – Gathering to Rejoice, and a sequel – Gathering to Remember. The Baptism Ministry accompanies the parents at each stage of their child's faith formation journey.

GATHERING TO REJOICE

Gathering to Rejoice occurs during pregnancy, and is the start of a life-long, family-centered faith formation. This gathering, which takes place during the third, fourth, or fifth month of pregnancy, brings together all parents at OLM who are expecting the birth of a child. It is a time for parents to meet others who are expecting an addition to their family. This social gathering is a time for rejoicing, a time to celebrate the new life they are carrying, and the new life whose birth they are awaiting. This gathering also includes some practical information, a special blessing for expectant parents, and light refreshments.

Gathering to Rejoice takes place whenever an expectant mother presents herself to a priest or deacon. It is usually on a Sunday in the Parish Center (formerly convent), and starts at 9:30 a.m.

GATHERING TO UNDERSTAND

The second component of Baptism at OLM gives parents an opportunity to more fully understand the meaning of the sacrament of baptism in their own life. Baptism is not something we receive, but rather a way of living, a vision of life, a relationship with God, and relationship with God's church. Godparents, if they are able, are encouraged to attend Gathering to Understand.

Gathering to Understand takes place on the second Sunday of each month at 10:30 a.m. in the Parish Center, formerly OLM convent.

GATHERING TO PREPARE

The third component of Baptism at OLM takes place on the

Saturday before the actual baptism is celebrated. It alerts parents to what will take place during the celebration of baptism during Sunday mass at OLM. This component helps parents celebrate the liturgy with greater understanding and attention.

Gathering to Prepare takes place in church on the fourth Saturday of each month at 1:00 p.m. for a Sunday baptism, and at 12:00 noon for a Saturday afternoon baptism.

GATHERING TO CELEBRATE

The fourth component of Baptism at OLM is the actual ceremony. Baptism always takes place during Mass, generally at the 10 a.m. or 12 noon Mass on a Sunday or at 5 p.m. at the anticipated Mass on a Saturday.

Baptisms take place within Sunday Mass because through the sacrament of baptism a child is incorporated into the Church, the community that gathers on Sunday. Christ was raised to new life on Easter Sunday. The Risen Lord appeared to his disciples most often on a Sunday. The Holy Spirit descended upon the Church on Pentecost Sunday. Sunday is the day when people are born to new life as Christians.

Gathering to Celebrate takes place on the fourth Saturday or Sunday of each month, except during Lent.

GATHERING TO REMEMBER

Gathering to Remember is a reunion of all parents who have had children baptized during the past year. It is intended to help parents of newly baptized to keep focused on the reality of their home as the "Domestic Church." It gives us a chance to gather once more, to joyfully remember, and to share their experiences in their journey of bringing up their children in the faith.

Gatherings to Remember are planned for the 1st Sunday of January each year.
