



## OUR SERVICES FOR HOLY WEEK

Beginning this Thursday, we celebrate the most important liturgies of the Church Year. We hope the following information will help you to better understand these services and will encourage you to join us!

### HOLY THURSDAY, April 18



There is only one Mass on Holy Thursday. That Mass, known as the “**Mass of the Lord’s Supper,**” will take place at **7:30 pm**. On entering the church, you will notice that the tabernacle will be empty. On this night, which celebrates the institution of the Eucharist, we begin with the absence of the Blessed Sacrament.

Following the homily, the pastor will wash the feet of representatives of the parish. This will be done in response to the Gospel Reading that relates how Jesus washed the feet of his Apostles at the Last Supper. The washing of feet reminds us that we are to be of service to others.

Just before the collection which will benefit the poor, the Holy Oils blessed by Cardinal Tobin will be brought before the congregation and then placed in the shrine near the baptismal font.

The Mass then continues and reaches its highpoint with the consecration and the reception of Holy Communion. Extra hosts are consecrated at this Mass for distribution during the services of Good Friday. At the end of the liturgy, these hosts are brought in solemn procession to the tabernacle located in our daily Mass chapel.

*Please note: Good Friday is a day of fast on which only one full meal is permitted and two lesser meals. No food is permitted in between meals. No meat may be eaten.*

### GOOD FRIDAY, April 19



On Good Friday, Mass is not celebrated. Instead there is the **Celebration of the Passion of the Lord at 3 pm, and then again at 7:30 pm**. This service begins with three readings, including the Passion of Jesus according to Saint John. After the readings, there are solemn petitions that embrace the needs of the Church and of all the world. Then a large cross is carried into the church. We then come forward to adore the cross on which hung the Savior of the world. The liturgy continues with the distribution of Holy Communion using hosts that were consecrated during the Mass of Holy Thursday. The service concludes with a final prayer by the priest.

### HOLY SATURDAY, April 20



The **Easter Vigil, which takes place at 8 pm**, is the highlight of the entire Church Year. The service begins in darkness. A new fire is blessed and the large Easter Candle is lit with a flame from the fire. The light then spreads to the candles of the congregation. We then listen to the Easter Proclamation that announces our salvation in Christ.

Following this, there are readings from the Old and New Testaments that proclaim the wondrous story of God’s love for his people and conclude with the Resurrection of Jesus.

After the readings, the water of the baptismal font is blessed. Afterwards we renew our baptismal promises and are sprinkled with water from the font. The priest then prays the great Eucharistic Prayer and we join in receiving the Body and Blood of Christ, our Risen Lord.

### EASTER SUNDAY, April 21



The **Mass of Easter Sunday** joyfully celebrates the Lord’s Resurrection. During the Mass, we renew our baptismal promises and are sprinkled with water from the baptismal font. The Mass includes the glorious hymns of Easter and the return of the word “Alleluia” to the liturgy. At the Mass, we encounter the Risen Lord as we receive Holy Communion. We then go forth from the liturgy to share the Good News, the Great News – the Lord is Risen! Of all the Sundays of the year, Easter Sunday is the most important. In fact, it is sometimes referred to as the Sunday of all Sundays!

**On Easter Sunday, Mass will be celebrated at 8 am, 10 am and 12 Noon.** Because of the number of people who join us for Mass on Easter and because there is no evening Mass on Easter Sunday, **Mass will also be celebrated in the Maria Room at 10 am and 12 Noon.**

### DATE ON CAPITAL CAMPAIGN: "WE ARE LIVING STONES"

You may recall that the Case Items for Parish Portion are the following:

- Purchase and Installation of a gas generator
- Repointing of the Church
- Replacement of windows on the school's 3rd floor
- Repairing the boiler in the school (done)
- Debt reduction

As far as the school boiler repair is concerned, we have spent a total of \$41,675.00 for the three repairs we have done. This figure is disbursed from the Capital Campaign. Pray, dear brothers and sisters, that there will be no more school boiler repairs in the near future. As of present, we have reached 100.20% of our goal (\$499,149.00) of which \$400,948.52 has been collected and \$174,734.56 disbursed to parish. Soon, we will be replacing the third floor school windows and the fund will be taken from the balance of WALs rebate. I am gently reminding those who have not fully paid the pledge to continue sending your payment to WALs office.

#### PARKING CONSIDERATION!

I ask your assistance in resolving a potentially dangerous situation. As you know, parking is not permitted along Brother Stan Drive. The area has been marked again with new signage and the curb painted red. However, parishioners regularly park there for Mass. Emergency vehicles cannot make the turn from Lembeck on to Brother Stan Drive and up Pearsall. As you know, seconds are precious for response time in a life-threatening emergency. I ask you to be considerate and to respect the traffic laws. I realize that parking is limited and remind you to allow adequate time for parking in legally designated spaces when attending Mass. Arriving close to the start of Mass and finding a spot close to the Church is unlikely. In the next few weeks, cones will also be placed on Brother Stan Drive during Masses as yet another reminder not to park there. Please abide by the parking regulations so as not to potentially endanger the life and safety of your neighbors.

## THE ENCOUNTER (SALUBONG)



OUR LADY OF MERCY CHURCH celebrates The Encounter (Salubong) on Easter Sunday, April 21, 2019 before the 12 noon Mass.

Salubong is the reunion of the Risen Christ and the Sorrowful Virgin Mary. The women of the parish gather at the vestibule with the statue of the Sorrowful Mother, yet unaware of her Son's resurrection. The statue of Mary is covered with the veil of mourning. The men gather at the bridge with the statue of the Risen Christ.

Both groups move in procession into Church. When both processions meet at the foot of the altar, Mary's mourning veil is removed by an "Angel". A "Choir of Angels" sing BE JOYFUL, MARY to signify Mary's joy at the knowledge of her Son's resurrection.

At the conclusion of Be Joyful, Mary, the organ swells with the opening verse of the Gathering Hymn for Mass. Both statues are placed on either side of the tabernacle, and we celebrate the Mass of Easter Sunday.
