

Dear Parishioners of Our Lady of Mercy,

I hope this finds you well and safe!

In Sunday's gospel reading, there is one important lesson that Jesus wants to teach us about prayer. He wants us to learn to be persistent in prayer. We are to persevere in prayer even when it seems like God is not listening to us, even when we do not see any results from our prayers.

I think it is important to realize that God is always going to do what is best for us, even if we do not understand why God does not answer our prayers as we would hope. We need to keep praying. We especially need to be persistent in lifting up the needs of our brothers and sisters in prayer. By praying for them, we become more aware of their needs, and we draw closer to them.

Even when there is nothing that we can do about a particular need or issue, we need to pray, because that is how we put those things into God's hands. There is a lot that goes on in our lives over which we have no control. If we try to take responsibility and shoulder all the grief and trouble we see, we cannot bear it. We need to be persistent and put those things into God's hands, because what is impossible for us is never too much for God. When we put those things in God's hands and learn to resign ourselves to God's will, then we can bear the weight of those burdens so much better, but that all depends on prayer.



As I write this column, I am in Austria on a pilgrimage that included a trip to see the Passion Play in Oberammergau, Germany. I am with Father Butchie and a group from our parish and a few folks from other parishes as well.

There were lots of persistent prayers prior to this trip. We prayed that it was really going to happen because it was cancelled in 2020 due to the Covid19 pandemic. There were prayers for a safe journey, for good health and healing for the sick, prayers for the souls of those who had died, and prayers requested for special intentions and for our spiritual growth. Really God is so good. The Lord answered our prayers, most of them were granted.

The main event of this journey was to watch the Passion Play that takes place every ten years. This event is another example of being persistent in prayer.

In the seventeenth century, the small village of Oberammergau, Germany was struck by a plague brought into the village by a man named Kaspar Schisler. In their sorrow over the suffering this terrible disease had brought to the community, the leaders of the town came together and vowed to hold a Passion Play every ten years. From that time on, not a single person died of the plague.

As I reflected on this event and most especially as I watched the play, it reminded me of the pandemic we have just gone through since the beginning of the year 2020. I prayed that through this year's play, which reminds us of how Christ came into the world, suffered, died and rose again, the whole world might be healed through our persistent prayer.

Our gospel this weekend is a reminder for us all to pray without ceasing for healing, peace throughout the world, and for our salvation.

CHANGE IN OUR COLLECTION PROCEDURE

Before the pandemic, it was the custom here at OLM for parishioners to participate in the presentation of the gifts at Sunday Mass. In addition to a few people bringing forward the bread and wine to be used during the liturgy, all those at Mass came from their pews and walked to the head of each aisle where they deposited their offerings in the baskets placed there by our Ministers of Hospitality or Ushers.



In this way, everyone had an opportunity to come forward and present their personal gifts to the Lord. Afterwards the baskets would be placed near the altar and then brought to the parish office.

Because of the pandemic, we stopped having people process forward and we asked those at Mass to place their offerings in the boxes near the baptismal font. At our Masses this

weekend, July 23 & 24, we will return to what was done previously. After the Creed and General Intercessions,

those at Mass will be invited to come forward with their financial donations and place them in the baskets at the head of each aisle.

We are reverting to this practice primarily for security reasons. Recently, several attempts have been made to break into the offering boxes to steal their contents. There was even an attempt to physically pick up and remove one of the boxes from the church.



As we come forward with our gifts, we can remember that the Lord not only wants us to offer our money but to also offer ourselves in service to Him and his Church.

Those using WESHARE, our online giving service, are welcome to join the procession of those coming forward to the baskets. If they wish, they may place a note or card in the basket indicating their use of online giving.


