

FISCAL YEAR 2022 REPORT FROM THE PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL

Our financial statement for the period that began July 1, 2021 and ended June 30, 2022 reflects our gradual emergence from the effect of the pandemic of two and a half years ago.

In the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2022, our parish operating income came to \$952,773.

The largest source of revenue was our Sunday, Easter, and Christmas collections which amounted to \$433,438.

The second major revenue source was the income generated by the rental of our school building to Starting Points (a privately operated early childhood program), it amounted to \$365,290.

The third largest source of income

came from restricted donations, gifts, and bequests, this amounted to \$81,676. This number includes \$50,000 restricted donations in December 2021.

Additional income came from various sources that are noted in the detailed financial report on our website.

In comparison to the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2021, our income in the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2022 increased \$16,553. This was due to an increase in our Sunday and Christmas offerings and an increase in the restricted rental income from the school

building. In the fiscal year that began July 1, 2021 and ended June 30, 2022, our parish operating expenses came to \$776,193.

The highest expense of \$367,394 was associated with salaries, benefits, pensions, payroll taxes, and insurance premiums.

The next highest expense of \$182,653 was related to our buildings, utilities, and equipment costs.

The third expense item of \$64,676 had to do with liturgical, office, and priest residential expenses. The other operating expense areas are noted in the detailed financial report.

In comparison to the previous fiscal year that ended June 30, 2021, our expenses were higher by \$13,360 in the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2022. This was primarily due to the offsetting effects of: (1) The reduction in salaries and employee benefits due to the reduction in the number of priests from two to one in mid-fiscal year 2022 (\$33,235),

(2) An increase in buildings, utilities, and equipment costs due to higher repairs and maintenance (\$20,059), higher equipment and furnishings (\$10,385), higher property and liability insurance premium (\$9,065), and higher cost of oil heat (\$5,233).

Non-operating revenues from the We Are Living Stones (WALS) capital campaign decreased by \$3,396 from \$4,409 in 2021 to \$1,013 in 2022. This was because most pledges have been fulfilled. The loan from SBA Payroll Protection Program amounting to \$53,953 was forgiven on November 16, 2021.

Non-operating expenses for fiscal year that ended June 30, 2022 included \$70,510 for repointing three brick walls and recaulking of all outside walls of the school building.

When we consider our total income (both operating and non-operating) and our total expenses (both operating and non-operating) we see that **the fiscal**

year that ended June 30, 2022 left us with a surplus of \$161,036. In the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2021, OLM showed a surplus of \$124,521.

ReportWe need to be aware that our parish
currently owes the Archdiocese
\$195,030 for the cost of past medical
benefits for our employees. The
Archdiocese has covered the cost of these

medical benefits since the parish was unable to do so.

The income generated by the rental of our school building is now sent directly to the Archdiocese to cover past medical benefits, and to cover current expenses associated with pension contributions, parish assessments, insurance premiums, etc.

Several much-needed repairs in the church, school, and parish center buildings require our urgent attention. A few examples are school playground retaining wall, church building concrete rear at foundation, bridge and parish center roof, and church bathrooms.

Without the income received from the rental of our school building, our parish would be in a serious financial situation. Collections for the current period are improving, but we still need to make up for the loss of revenue we suffered and continue to suffer during the pandemic. As we continue with much needed repairs and maintenance to our aging plant, we rely on

your on-going support of your parish.
