

Dear Parishioners of Our Lady of Mercy,

Welcome Advent Season!

Yes, we are now in the first week of Advent. This is the time when we begin to prepare to celebrate the coming of the Son of God in flesh. A few weeks from now, we will celebrate the birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ. This is as good a time as any to start thinking about what precious gift we can give to Jesus this Christmas. So, I urge you to really ask yourself what that gift might be.

One of the preparations for Christmas that our parish offers is the Advent reflection series being given by Father Anton Sarento called "Journeying to Bethlehem." 


