

Holy Week: the big flip-flop

With the celebration of Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, we now enter into Holy Week, the time when we recall the mystery of Jesus' life-giving death and resurrection. The mood of today's Liturgy

does an incredible flip-flop. We begin with the joyous entrance of Jesus into the city of Jerusalem. Luke tells us that, as Jesus rode on a colt, a gentle beast rather than a mighty stallion as a conqueror might have used, the crowds are filled with joyful anticipation. They "threw their cloaks over the colt, and helped Jesus to mount. As he rode along, the people were spreading their cloaks on the road; and now as he was approaching the slope of the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of his disciples began to praise God aloud with joy for all the mighty works they had seen."

The Liturgy then turns from the triumph of the entrance to the suffering of Jesus' passion. The gospel account, again from Luke, presents Jesus' betrayal, trial on false charges, humiliation and abandonment by his followers. The reaction of those at the scene varies; some people jeer, while others tremble in fear. One of the criminals being crucified with Jesus asks him to save them if he is the Christ. The other humbly asks, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Surprisingly, the centurion who was presiding over the scene, "witnessed what had happened, glorified God, and said, 'This man was innocent beyond doubt." In the culmination of the account, "Jesus cried out in a loud voice, 'Father, into your hands I commend my spirit'; and when he had said this, he breathed his last." The scene is set for our prayerful and grateful entrance into this Holy Week.

The *Via Dolorosa* (Latin for "Sorrowful Way", often translated "Way of Suffering") is a processional route in the Old City of Jerusalem. It represents the path that Jesus would have taken, forced by the Roman soldiers, on the way to his crucifixion. The winding route from the

former Antonia Fortress to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre — a distance of about 2,000 feet is a celebrated place of Christian pilgrimage. The current route has been established since the 18th century, replacing various earlier versions. It is today marked by nine Stations of the Cross; there have been fourteen stations since the late 15th century, with the remaining five stations being inside the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.



BISHOP BYRNE has changed the age of the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Diocese of Springfield beginning next year 2023. The new age is at the end of Grade 9 or the beginning of Grade 10. There will be more information in the fall.
