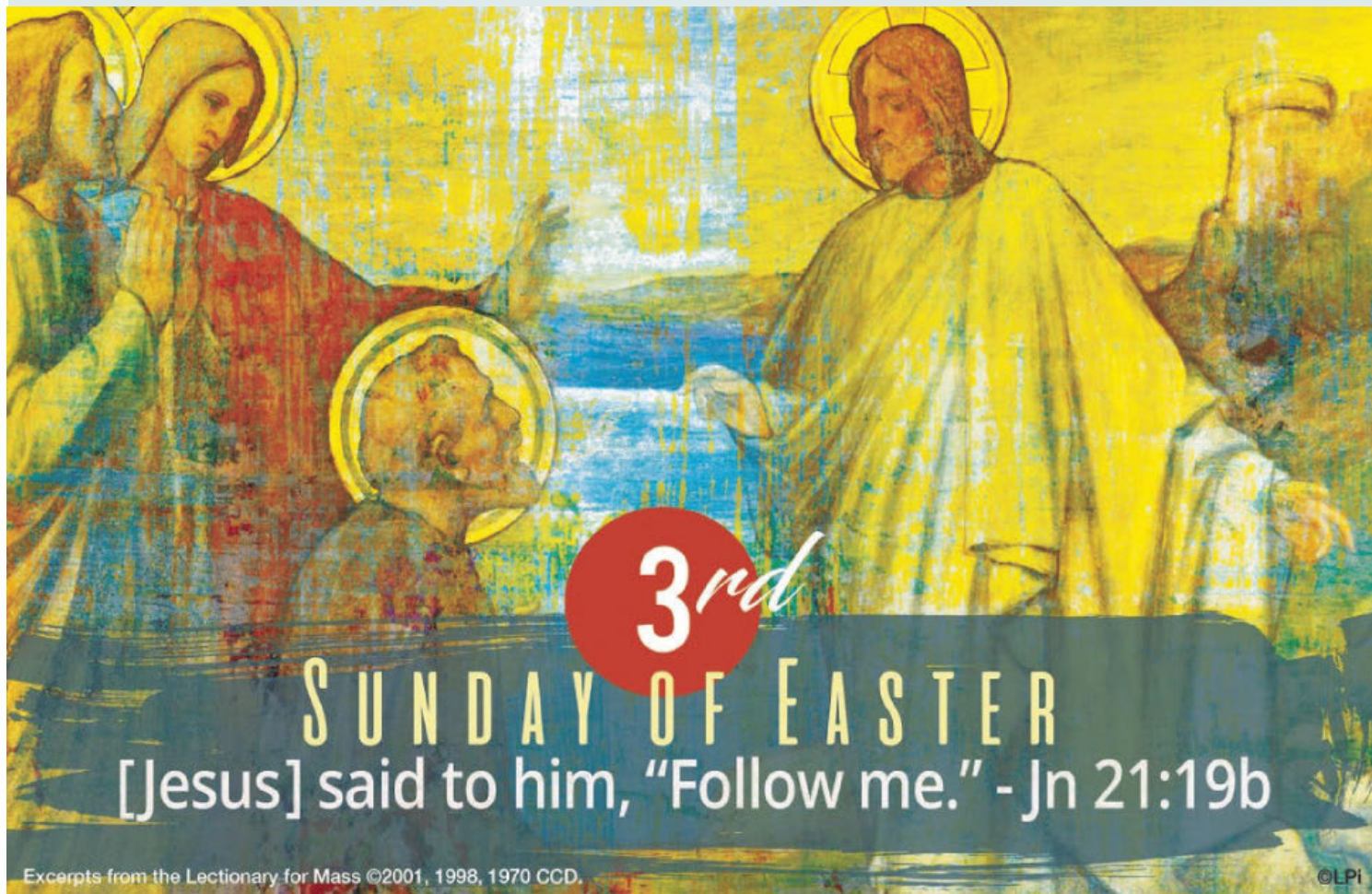

Dear Friends,

This weekend is the middle of three weekends for the celebrations for one of the happiest moments in the life of a parish, the reception of the Eucharist for the first time for our children, 160 in all. After eight months of preparation, they will come to the altar to receive Jesus' greatest gift to His Church, **HIMSELF, IN HIS REAL PRESENCE**, for the life of the believer. And in less than a month, I will give the gift of the Holy Spirit to 162 of our 9th graders in the Sacrament of Confirmation. And all of these celebrations have returned to normal.

It is a good time to remember that we are a sacramental church, that we believe that Christ acts through designated celebrational moments, during which He has promised to be present in a powerful way to deepen the life of the believer's union with Himself. These celebrational moments, of which there are seven, form the backbone, as it were, of the Church's spiritual life and as a Catholic walks through life, they mark his/her continued re-creation in the image of Jesus, the 2nd Adam. This is why we believe these moments are so important, because they do effectuate that change into that new man, or woman, who now becomes the living Christ in the world. And this is why the pandemic, with its social distancing and "virtual everything" has proven to be such a danger to the sacramental life of the Church.

As we come to these moments which are the highlight of the parish's life in April, May and June, I like to remind everyone of their significance for us, especially after two years of truncated celebrations. Of course we can pray anywhere, anytime. Of course we can read Scripture anywhere, anytime. But the special gift of Christ to His Church are those graced moments when He has told us He would be present and active in the community. These sacramental moments nourish the believer on his/her journey. This is especially true of the Eucharist for it is in being fed by the Lord with His own Body and Blood that we find the nourishment to stay close to Him and to be His presence in the world, **for the life of the world**.

Of course, this is not without its challenge. The challenge is in what follows. Being formed in a faith-filled environment is not a one-shot deal. It's not a sprint; it's a marathon. In a world in which we have little trust in people and institutions, (e.g. government, the media, the church, etc.), the kind of trust the Lord offers us can only be built slowly, in an environment into which we invite the Lord, day after day, after day. And that environment has to be multi-dimensional and multi-faceted, the home (through prayer and Scripture), the classroom (through instruction and formation in some form of Religious Education model) and worship (weekly attendance at Mass). It's only when all three are happening that there is real hope of finding in Jesus that trustworthy companion and friend that He is. So, the challenge to the families of our first communicants is to make all three things happen. I hope and pray our parents

are ready, willing and able to accept this challenge. That challenge is even more pressing in the context of the pandemic we have all just lived through.

As Catholics, we need to rediscover the power of the Sacraments in our lives, to participate in them more faithfully and more fruitfully and give example to these children of ours who come to them for the first time, that we really believe in how special they are.

PS. May I ask a favor, for those who can do so. You know I have spoken or written that I have served on the Board of Trustees of Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Newark, for almost thirty years now. These last years have been a financial challenge for CCAN, mostly caused by the pandemic. As the Agency struggles to get back on its feet, the Board members have been asked to help, even the clergy, by “selling” 50/50 raffle tickets, as part of the annual Gala. I have 15 tickets to sell, actually only 13, I’ve already sold two. If anyone is interested, please email me. The tickets cost \$50. I think the prize should be somewhere around \$10,000. Thank you.

- Easter Collection: \$64,669

Total parish support for the month of April was \$169,168. As a point of comparison, total church support for the month of April, 2021 was \$134,476 and for April, 2020 (during the lockdown) it was \$142,625. But for 2019, pre-Covid, it was \$170,954. Thank you for your support of the parish and the work of the Gospel.

TODAY'S READINGS

1. Acts of the Apostles 5:27-32, 40-41

In these early chapters of Acts, Luke shows how ineffectual is the power of the Jewish Temple authorities when it is up against the power of God's word. Taken into custody a second time, and warned a second time about spreading their message of life in the Risen Christ, the Apostles once again fearlessly announce the Good News, right in front of the court, which is again powerless to stop them, even in their very presence. They are sent off again, but to no avail.

2. Revelation 5:11-14

Though another tried to claim their loyalty and homage (the Emperor, Domitian), John's vision affirms the everlasting reign of God and of Jesus, the Christ, the Lamb that was slain. Today's excerpt is a special hymn of praise to this "Lamb that was slain." Indicating fullness, seven attributes are ascribed to the Lamb by the author. And this praise will be offered not only by the Heavenly Court, but also by the entire universe.

3. John 21:1-19

The disciples have gone back to Galilee (as Jesus had directed them). In this excerpt they have even returned to fishing, but caught nothing. Following the directives from a voice from the shore, their nets become full and in the miraculous catch, they recognize the Master's presence. As in other appearances, full recognition comes when they share a meal with the Lord. The verses that follow relate not only the rehabilitation of Peter (threefold denial erased by a threefold affirmation of love), but also his call to assume a pastoral responsibility for the sheep that was once exercised by the Master, Himself.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. Have you ever had the experience of a dying person of faith who seemed utterly free from fear? What do you think it took for them to get to that place?
2. Peter wavered, denied, then believed wholeheartedly. Sound familiar? Has it happened to you that way in your life?
3. Like Peter, have you ever gone somewhere for God when you didn't want to?

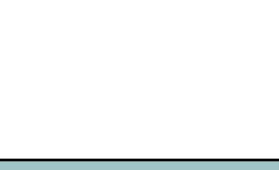

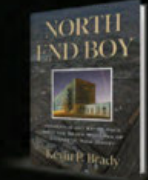
