





## Catholic Faith Character or Caricature?

I've always thought that the word "caricature" was, somehow, derivative of the word "character." After all, the words sound similar when you hear them spoken. However they actually emerge from two different root words: Caricature comes from a Latin word meaning "the act of loading or exaggerating:" Whereas, character comes from a Greek word meaning "to stamp or to bear a distinctive mark or trait."

We are most familiar with the idea of "caricature" from the carnival or amusement park: They are pictures of a person or thing in which certain striking characteristics are exaggerated in order to create a comic or grotesque effect.





Like the President and so many others, the Church is often portrayed as a caricature of itself: And this is not always done with an eye toward light-hearted humor. More often than not, the caricature is presented as the real thing to people who don't know any better or are not willing to research the matter. And so, unfortunately, many people make decisions about the Faith based on grotesque distortions. The following are some examples:

**Caricature:** The Sacraments and the Priesthood get in the way of real, personal faith.

**Response:** A purely un-mediated faith (no 'middle man') is a distortion of the Christian Gospel. Christ himself instituted the Sacraments and the Church to mediate his continued presence. In this way his

divine wisdom and revelation is conformed to our human nature: Sacraments involve physical elements, human touch and human voice. After all, Christ came to us in human form. The myth of unmediated faith is a reaction against corrupt people in the Church, not the reality of the Church herself.

**Caricature:** Because Catholics don't go about proclaiming that they are "saved," the Catholic Church doesn't preach the Gospel of Salvation: Rather, the Church keeps people in a state of doubt.

Response: At the root of this is a fundamental difference in the understanding of what Salvation means. It is the difference between "forensic justification" (Protestant) and "sanctification" (Catholic) respectively. "Forensic Justification" simply means that, because Christ took all the sins of the world on himself, God is able to look at human believers and declare them "justified" or "guilt free." By contrast, Catholics understand the saving work of Christ as having initiated a process which makes us truly holy: Hence, we are not simply "declared" just or righteous in the eyes of God, but really and truly transformed into holy people . . . saints! (See Phil. 2:12)

**Assertion:** The Church is a big institution which exists for its own sake: It is a man-made bureaucracy which uses Christianity to make money and to control people's lives.

**Response:** Actually the Church lives in hope of ceasing to exist altogether. "Until everything is subject to him, 'until there be realized new heavens and a new earth in which justice dwells, the pilgrim Church, in her sacraments and institutions, which belong to this present age, carries the mark of this world which will pass..."(CCC #671)

A good summary statement and source of perspective comes in the next section of the Catechism, (#672): "On her pilgrimage, the Church has also experienced the 'discrepancy existing between the message she proclaims and the human weakness of those to whom the Gospel has been entrusted." Indeed, do we not see this in the narrative of the Gospels themselves?

#### Monday, Jan 24, 2022 MEMORIAL OF FRANCIS DE SALES, BISHOP, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

God, our shield and our strength

We live in tumultuous times for sure. But the world has been topsy-turvy before. Saint Francis de Sales lived during the religious, political, and social upheaval of the Protestant Reformation. And he became known for his gentleness and patience in the face of it. Leave it to him, the patron saint of writers, to pen a prayer that is timeless balm for troubled souls: "Do not look forward to what may happen tomorrow; the same everlasting Father who cares for you today will take care of you tomorrow and every day. Either he will shield you from suffering, or he will give you unfailing strength to bear it. Be at peace, then, put aside all anxious thoughts and imaginations . . ." A balm for these troubled times. "If a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand."

#### Tuesday, Jan 25, 2022 FEAST OF THE CONVERSION OF SAINT PAUL, APOSTLE

Harden not your heart

Paul has always been a controversial figure. Before becoming a Christian, he was a persecutor of Jesus' followers. Paul's biblical words advising women to be submissive to their husbands have been alternately obeyed, rejected, and reinterpreted. But the word "conversion" on this feast reminds us what Christian life is about. The Catechism of the Catholic Church quotes Saint Ambrose on the "two conversions" in Christian life—one of them a one-time event and the other ongoing. "There are water and tears, the water of Baptism and the tears of repentance." What parts of your life still require repentance?

#### Wednesday, Jan 26, 2022 MEMORIAL OF TIMOTHY AND TITUS, BISHOPS

Stay the course

Evangelizing and living the gospel demands much of us. Saints Timothy and Titus serve as examples to us of holding fast to the faith among difficult circumstances. Friends and companions of Saint Paul, they ended up becoming bishops and leaders of the early church. They helped Paul to spread the gospel during those difficult early years. Timothy paid the ultimate price for encouraging others to embrace the emerging Christian faith. Reflect on the ways you choose to follow Jesus Christ and embrace his mission despite the challenges and difficulties it presents.

#### Thursday, Jan 27, 2022 MEMORIAL OF ANGELA MERICI, RELIGIOUS FOUNDER

Wise counsel for the overwhelmed
On this memorial of Saint Angela Merici, 16th-century founder of the Ursuline Sisters, it makes sense to recall one of her many insights into faith-filled living. She advised the overwhelmed thus: "Do not lose heart, even if you should discover that you lack qualities necessary for the work to which you are called. He who called you will not desert you, but the moment you are in need he will stretch out his saving hand." May you find that saving hand when you reach the end of your rope. "Is a lamp brought in to be placed under a bushel basket or under a bed, and not to be placed on a lampstand?"

#### Friday, Jan 28, 2022 MEMORIAL OF THOMAS AQUINAS, PRIEST, RELIGIOUS, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Root yourself in honesty

G.K. Chesterton once said of philosopher and theologian Thomas Aquinas, "Being himself resolved to argue, to argue honestly, to answer everybody, to deal with everything, he produced books enough to sink a ship or stock a library." We could use a little more Thomas in our media, especially social media, because today we're not always sure if things are actually true or merely "internet true." For Thomas, honesty was key to communication. He considered it beautiful, honorable, and a reflection of moral goodness itself. May we take to heart his commitment to honesty in all of our communication.

Sea of hope



One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 – 1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great. His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today.
