

Did you Know?

Why do we praise God? Does He really need our praise?

Think of someone never being taught to say thank you to anyone, never being really appreciative of anything they receive in life, because they would just expect it to be done. They would have no appreciation for anything that others had done for them, not considering the hard work, sacrifices, and generosity of others. That person would be missing out on a part of life that comes from appreciating others and being grateful for what they receive.

First, we give praise because it is right to praise God's goodness, to thank Him for all He has provided for us. After all, God could be less merciful and still be perfectly just. But He loves us so much, He chooses to be merciful.

The praise we give to God is not only deserved and our just duty to God, but also helps to keep us mindful of God's goodness and love and how He watches over us and guides us if we open ourselves to Him.

In the Missal Common Preface IV, we praise the gifts of God.

The priest says, 'Let us give thanks to the Lord our God'. And we reply, 'It is right and just.' The priest continues by saying, 'It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God. For, although you have no need of our praise, yet our thanksgiving is itself your gift, since our praises add nothing to your greatness but profit us for salvation through Christ our Lord.'

If we fail to praise and appreciate God's goodness and mercy, and we don't thank Him for all He has given to us in our lives, we hurt our own spiritual life. We risk falling into the sin of presumption and pride thinking everything comes from us and we risk our own salvation. The Prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayers speaks well when it states: 'Let us give thanks to the Lord, it is right and just.' Deacon Alan Amaral

Setting Our Hearts Aflame

The Scraggly Tree...

Out of the ground the LORD God made various trees grow that were delightful to look at and good for food, with the tree of life in the middle of the garden and the tree of the knowledge of good and bad. Gen 2:9

As I took some time off this past week I would like to share a piece I wrote years about a Scraggly Tree:

Every day, as I go out the door, this one lonely tree attracts my attention. It is the only tree in the middle of the woods that is barren of leaves. It looks so out of place next to the gorgeous green oaks, maples and evergreens. Its branches are far from graceful, each branch sticking out at odd angles, its bark gray and cracking. This tree is far from the trees described in Genesis, but yet it holds a certain charm. I ponder the tree's life... What did it look like when it was younger? Why are its arms so bent? How did it get this way? I then realized that this tree does, in a way, resemble a tree of life, albeit, towards the end of life.

I am sure many have gazed upon this tree and thought of how it spoils the look of the forest, others see the tree's uniqueness and yet others may not even notice the tree. Isn't this also how we see others? Sometimes we dismiss or ignore the not-so-pretty or the elderly. We do not look beyond the surface. We do not see the beauty beneath nor the wisdom waiting to spew forth.

This summer as we travel to the Cape, or other destinations, and you are stuck in traffic, take a good look at the people in the surrounding cars. Pause for a moment and ponder their lives. Notice whether they are joyful or upset and ask God to watch over them.

The next time you see someone on the street or in Church who looks lonely, or as out of place as my scraggly tree, give them a smile or a wave to let them know you care. And when you return home remember this person and say a prayer for them. Every person, in every shape size and age is a child of God.

Sacred Heart Accompanist:

With the departure of Sacred Heart Church accompanist Tom Roussell, Jimmy Dolan, organist and pianist at Sts. Martha and Mary Church, will be filling in during the interim. Jimmy should already be a familiar face to parishioners of Sacred Heart Church who attend Mass, as he has been accompanying at Sacred Heart Church already nearly every other weekend for the past year. Jimmy began his position in Lakeville in the fall of 2018 after our most previous accompanist, Sandy Cummings, resigned. Beginning piano study in his youth, Jimmy previously subbed at Our Lady of Lourdes, Carver, and St. Thomas Aguinas, Bridgewater, as well as occasionally filling in at Sts. Martha and Mary Church. Once he assumed the position at Sts. Martha and Mary Church, he began transitioning to the organ and now feels comfortable with both the organ and piano when accompanying at Mass. Please welcome Jimmy as he helps out at Sacred Heart Church.

Organ Grant:

Several months ago, St. Isidore Parish applied for a music grant from Oregon Catholic Press, the company that provides the Breaking Bread Hymnals at the churches of Sacred Heart and St. Rose of Lima. Each year the company allows parishes to apply for grants to be used for various music needs. Our Parish request was for funding for a new or used replacement organ at Sacred Heart Church. Our hope was that we would receive some funds to begin an organ fund even if the full amount needed did not come through. Unfortunately, we were not one of the parishes selected this year for a grant. However, we have been encouraged to apply again next year. St. Mary's Cemetery Notice Effective as of August 8, 2022



Notice St. Mary's Cemetery ** Notice**

** Effective as of August 8, 2022**

In order to keep St. Mary's Cemetery respectful of our Catholic Beliefs and a beautiful final resting place for our Beloved the following will be enforced:

*All non-religious items must be removed from plots, mementos of your beloved (e.g. sport items; little figurines; toys; models; banners/flags; hooks/wires; all candles; solar lighting; hanging plants; balloons; pinwheels; etc. (exception American as well as branches of U.S. military flags; fraternal emblems for Veterans, Elks, and MMC; as well as first responders' flags are allowed). May we suggest a "memory garden" in your yard for these items is more appropriate.

*No borders (consisting of: wood, bricks; fencing; stones; patio blocks; mulch; etc.); no shrubs or bushes that are not in a vase attached to headstone; perennials that spread out past 8" from headstone or detract from headstone are not allowed.

*Religious statues that are more than 8" from monument base or taller than headstone must be taken home.

*Plants are only allowed to be 8" or less out from monument base in the **front** of headstone (not on the sides or back of the headstone); concrete flower vases/pots/containers not attached to base will be discarded.

*Plants not watered and maintained will be discarded.

*No decorations or plants allowed on a single grave/lot without a Monument/Headstone.

These requirements are necessary for mowing, weed whacking, and access to all plots. All inappropriate items left in cemetery will be removed after August 8, 2022.


