

**<u>UPDATE ON SOME SUMMER PROJECTS</u>**: 1) VanZandt Plumbing installed a new sewer connection the bathroom to the street at St. Mary's in Lee. New technology made it so we did not have to dig a new line, but simply insert a new line through the existing. Between snaking/cutting out the roots and inserting the new line it cost about \$5,000. 2) We have signed a contract for replacing the roof over the Library-side entrance at St. Mary's Church in Lee. Work should begin soon. Then we can repair & repaint the damaged ceiling. 3) Fr. Brian will be working with a family from our school to build a new Christmas Creche for St. Joseph's Church. We have the wood, it's time to build. 4) Richard Brittain is building a vegetable stand for the Community Garden. 5) We look forward to repaying the back parking lot at St. Mary's Church. As part of the project a water line will be installed from the rain cisterns up at the rectory down to the Community Garden, and a fiber optic line will be run from the rectory to the church (saving over \$130 a month for internet at the Church). 6) We are lining up a lot of tree work at the cemetery ... it's very expensive but we've lost a lot of trees last winter and with the ash bores. 7) We are building simple enclosure up at St. Mary's cemetery for the truck and all the stuff stored outside by the garage. 8) A generous person will be repairing the fence in front of St. Joseph's Church. The granite posts have been broken for years. || And all this while completely clean the school and maintain the grounds at our churches and cemeteries. Thank you to Jeff and our maintenance crew!

The Diocese of Springfield provides VIR-TUS® in-person and Zoom awareness training for adults to help identify and prevent child sexual abuse.

The Protecting God's Children<sup>®</sup> Program for Adults teaches clergy, diocesan / parish / school / agency employees, volunteers, parents and other caring adults to recognize the warning signs of sexual abuse and to respond appropriately.

Effective July 11, 2022 in-person training sessions are offered weekly at the Pastoral Center in Springfield, Massachusetts on the following days and times:

- 9:00 AM First and Third Monday of Each Month
- 1:00 PM Second and Fourth Thursday of Each Month
- 6:00 PM Second Thursday of Each Month

Training sessions are three-hours in length. Given the sensitive nature of material presented, attendance at these three-hour training session is restricted to adults. Please note that a ZOOM option is available for those unable to attend in-person.

In addition to the adult trainings listed above, trainings will be held at various locations throughout the Diocese of Springfield during the year. For a list of available training sessions, please register for a VIRTUS® *Online* account or log into your current account at www.virtusonline.org.
