

### Did you know?

It costs \$600,000 to run the parish each year plus an additional \$124,000 for mortgage payments.

Our total collections and other contributions fall short of our cost of operating the parish by almost \$6,000 per month.

This is not sustainable for the parish because we are losing \$66,000 per year.

### But together, we can make a difference!

If 600 families gave just \$1 more per week, that would translate into \$30,000 per year which is almost half of our annual shortfall.

If 350 of those families gave an additional \$3 per week that would add another \$37,000 and that would solve our \$66,000 annual shortfall.

Dear Parish Family,

This Saturday, January 22, marks the 49<sup>th</sup> anniversary when the U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion on demand in this country. According to the National Right to Life Committee, more than 62.5 million babies have been aborted since 1973. As Catholics and Christians, we are all called to advocate and pray for an end of this tragedy and what Pope Francis calls a "throwaway culture." As Saint Teresa of Calcutta warned, "A nation that kills its children in the womb has lost its soul."

For nearly 50 years, pro-life advocates from around the country have gathered and prayed together in our nation's capitol, to march from the National Mall to Capitol Hill and the steps of the Supreme Court, seeking a reversal of *Roe v. Wade*. This year the March for life takes place on Friday, January 21. In the face of such evil, we are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord's help. As a people of faith we believe our prayers are heard. We know that it is always better to light one candle than curse the darkness.

I invite you to join me for a Holy for Life this Wednesday, January 19 at 7:00 pm in the church. We must all pray for others to see and respect the dignity of every life, from its very beginning (conception) to its natural end. We can also observe the actual anniversary of Roe v. Wade on January 22 with penitential practices of prayer and fasting.




