This will be an opportunity for Fr. Rob to hear from you about how the parish can best serve you in the months and years to come.

If you can't make the parish listening session, we will provide you with an online survey to share your opinion after the listening session date.

#### Some of the questions that will be discussed are:

How do you personally encounter Jesus Christ?

What draws you to St. Joseph Parish?

What are the joys of your parish life?

What are the difficulties and obstacles to active parish life that you have encountered?

What would you like to see St. Joseph's parish offer? What hinders people from being active in our parish?



#### Did you know?

It costs \$600,000 to run the parish each year plus an additional \$124,000 for mortgage payments.

Our total collections and other contributions fall short of our cost of operating the parish by almost \$6,000 per month. This is not sustainable for the parish because we are losing \$66,000 per year.

#### But together, we can make a difference!

If 600 families gave just \$1 more per week, that would translate into \$30,000 per year which is almost half of our annual shortfall.

If 350 of those families gave an additional \$3 per week that would add another \$37,000 and that would solve our \$66,000 annual shortfall.

Dear Parish Family,

This Saturday, January 29 we will host a Synod Listening Session in the School Multipurpose Room from 9:00 am – 12 Noon and all are invited to attend. By now you might be asking, "So what exactly is a Synod?" A Synod is a Greek word (*synodos*) meaning a meeting or assembly. The two Greek words that make up synod are *syn* meaning "together" and *hodos* meaning "way or journey." Cardinal Wilton Gregory put it this way: "This Synod offers us the opportunity to be with each other, to invite our family and friends back to the faith, to listen to each other's joys and sorrows, and share our hopes and dreams for our parishes."

The entire Catholic Church has been asked to participate in the upcoming Synod of Bishops. In preparation for the International Synod of Bishops in 2023, Pope Francis is asking for your input on the topic of "For a Synodal Church, Communion, Participation, and Mission." People of every age, Catholics and non-Catholics alike, are invited to give their feedback and input.



What makes this Synod different from all the others? First, the Pope is requesting that the whole Church participate in the Synod. The Holy Father wants to hear from the lay faithful, clergy and religious from the local parishes before the 2023 gathering of Bishops in Rome. In our Archdiocese, we will pray, listen and talk with one another through parish listening sessions and Archdiocesan listening sessions. Second, this Synod is a special opportunity to reflect and reconnect with our parish communities. It is a time when we can invite people to return not only to Sunday Mass but also to the life of the parish. It begins by listening to each other's joys, hopes, sorrows and fears.

This Synod is not about changing any Church teachings but rather walking with each other as brothers and sisters in Christ in a world that has been changed by the pandemic. At the same time we are hopeful as we look at the path forward. If your schedule allows, please join me for the Synod listening session this Saturday. Just come as you are; no RSVP is required.

**Rosary Makers** has begun in-person monthly meetings every first Monday of the month after the 8am mass from 8:30am - 9:30am at the Cry Room.


