John 2:1-11

Wow! I remember the last time I called my mom, "woman". It didn't go over well. Jesus is not using it in the same context that I was (ummm, being fresh with my mom). There's more going on here than meets the eye. Although the miracle itself is fantastic, it's really in the interaction between mother, Son and the servers that we need to pay attention to. Woman, believe it or not was an affectionate term in Jesus' time. But in this instance Jesus is addressing his mom as God would. Remember, she is the new woman, new Eve. A woman who trusts, believes and is obedient to God.


