Journey to the Foot of the Cross – We have time to grow this Lent Remember the formula. 10 Commandments, 7 sacraments, 3 persons in the Trinity. For Lent, the Church gives us almost a slogan—Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving—as the three things we need to work on during the season.

PRACTICAL WAYS TO GROW THIS LENT:

Read a spiritual book, read the Bible (Isaiah, Proverbs, Psalms, Jeremiah, Gospels), develop a spiritual habit (go to Mass daily), focus on defeating a recurring sin, develop a virtue, go to Confession, commit to a service, commit to Lenten services, and keep a spiritual journal.

Let us pray: God of all goodness, we want to take this time and use it to your glory. To spend time learning and be closer to you. We know that every creation is a gift from you: our lives, the earth, everything we eat and enjoy. May this time help us to focus on your generosity and our responsibility to protect and care for the land and those among us. Open our eyes, hearts and minds to everything you want to show us. We ask you in your Holy Name. Amen



FROM THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

The Catechism of the Catholic Church on Lent: By the solemn forty days of Lent, the Church unites herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert as we journey closer to His Passion, Last Supper, Calvary and the Resurrection...

The temptation in the desert shows Jesus, the humble Messiah, who triumphs over Satan by his total adherence to the plan of salvation willed by the Father. The kingdom of heaven was inaugurated on earth by Christ. "This kingdom shone out before men in the word, in the works and in the presence of Christ". The Church is the seed and beginning of this kingdom. Its keys are entrusted to Peter. Christ's Transfiguration aims at strengthening the apostles' faith in anticipation of his Passion: the ascent on to the "high mountain" prepares for the ascent to Calvary. Christ, Head of the Church, manifests what his Body contains and radiates in the sacraments: "the hope of glory" and Jesus went up to Jerusalem voluntarily, knowing well that there he would die a violent death because of the opposition of sinners Jesus' entry into Jerusalem manifests the coming of the kingdom that the Messiah-King, welcomed into his city by children and the humble of heart, is going to accomplish by the Passover of his **Death and Resurrection.**
