

FROM THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

The Catechism of the Catholic Church on Lent: Jesus' entry into Jerusalem manifested the coming of the kingdom that the King-Messiah was going to accomplish by the Passover of his Death and Resurrection. It is with the cel-

ebration of that entry on Palm Sunday that the Church's liturgy solemnly opens Holy Week. *How will Jerusalem welcome her Messiah?*

Although Jesus had always refused popular attempts to make him king, he chooses the time and prepares the details for his messianic entry into the city of "his father David". Acclaimed as son of David, as the one who brings salvation (*Hosanna* means "Save!" or "Give salvation!"), the "King of glory" enters his City "riding on an ass". Jesus conquers the Daughter of Zion, a figure of his Church, neither by ruse nor by violence, but by the humility that bears witness to the truth. And so the subjects of his kingdom on that day are children and God's poor, who acclaim him as had the angels when they announced him to the shepherds. Their acclamation,

"Blessed be he who comes in the name of the Lord", is taken up by the Church in the *"Sanctus"* of the Eucharistic liturgy that introduces the memorial of the Lord's Passover. COLLECTION

Journey to the Foot of the Cross – As we approach Palm Sunday



Let us enter the Lord's journey into Jerusalem, which means city of Peace . . . Next Sunday is "Palm Sunday, let us recall: The very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and strew them on the road. The crowds preceding him and those following kept crying out and say-

ing: "Hosanna to the Son of David: blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest." ~~Matthew 21: 8-9

Let us reflect on our joys and our sorrows and how they attach us to the life of Jesus: Imagine taking the journey with Our Lord into Jerusalem over 2,000 years ago. We celebrate his entrance into the city under showers of praise with cries of "Hosanna," then within a day, look on as we are horrified when we see him led away under clouds of torment with cries of "Crucify him!"

We pray: Lord Jesus, as we prepare to walk with You to recall Your passion, death and resurrection, help us to accept our disappointments as well as our joys, our feelings of rejection as well as our feelings of acceptance, and our struggles as well as our times of ease. Lord Jesus, as we prepare to walk with You, give us the strength to live Your Gospel with Your love and compassion in our relationships, with Your mercy and forgiveness in situations or with individuals that afflict pain, with Your justice when we see others wronged, and with Your comfort when we or others suffer loss. Amen


