

The Catechism of the Catholic Church on Lent:
Palm Sunday in the Catholic Church


The Palm leaves are sacramental when blessed, a "sacred sign" instituted by the Catholic Church. "It prepares believers to receive the fruit of the sacraments and sanctify different circumstances of life" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 166

We have reached the beginning of Holy Week, and Palm Sunday commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him, as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect. Palm

branches are a widely recognized symbol of peace and victory. Jesus riding on a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in

war.

Journey to the Foot of the Cross – Palm Sunday

Let us enter the Lord's journey into Jerusalem, which means city of Peace . . . , let us recall: The very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and strew them on the road. The crowds preceding him and those following kept crying out and saying: "Hosanna to the Son of David: blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest." ~ Matthew 21: 8-9

• Let us reflect on our joys and our sorrows and how they attach us to the life of Jesus: Imagine taking the journey with Our Lord into Jerusalem over 2,000 years ago. We celebrate his entrance into the city under showers of praise with cries of "Hosanna," then within a day, look on as we are horrified when we see him led away under clouds of *torment with cries of* — "Crucify him!"

We pray: Lord Jesus, as we prepare to walk with You to recall Your passion, death and resurrection, help us to accept our disappointments as well as our joys, our feelings of rejection as well as our feelings of acceptance, and our struggles as well as our times of ease. Amen
