

Dear brothers and sisters in the Risen Lord - Happy Easter!

The celebration of the Solemnity of Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ starts with the Easter Vigil. The first part of the Easter vigil is called the 'Liturgy of the Light' when fire and Easter Candle are blessed and after the Easter Candle is lighted, it is taken into the dark church in a solemn procession, proclaiming the light of Christ. This candle is a symbol of Christ who rising in glory dispels the darkness of our hearts and minds.

In the four Gospels we hear about all kinds of commotion happening on Easter morning. Saint John, who was an eyewitness of the Risen Lord, writes; "On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." (John 20:1-2)

Saint John further writes in his Gospel: "On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, 'Peace be with you." (Jn. 20:19)

Similarly, in the Gospel of Saint Luke (24:13-35), we hear that on that very day, two of his disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus. Risen Jesus joined them on the way, but they were unable to recognize Him because they were downcast. They were hoping that he (Jesus the Nazarene) would be the one to redeem Israel. But now with His death, all their hopes and expectations were shattered.

Darkness, fear, sadness...do they sound familiar to us, especially as we continue our fight with Coronavirus and watch the horror of the Ukraine war! They certainly do. On a personal level, this darkness of fear and sadness could also be caused by loss of a loved one, terminal illness, family, or financial problem, and more importantly due to sin.

The Easter candle being carried in the dark church is the symbol of Risen Jesus who dispels the darkness caused by fear, sadness, death, and sin. Without the Risen Lord, there will be darkness in our lives, in our society and in the world. And anyone who has eyes to see can see that it is getting worse day by day. It is only the Risen Lord who brings light and true life when people accept Him. The Risen Lord wants to come in our lives, in our darkness and fill us with His peace and new life if only we open our hearts and let him in.

Pope Francis, in his 2020 Easter message, said; "This is no magic formula that makes problems vanish. No, the resurrection of Christ is not that. Instead, it is the victory of love over the root of evil, a victory that does not "by-pass" suffering and death, but passes through them, opening a path in the abyss, transforming evil into good: this is the unique hallmark of the power of God. The Risen Lord is also the Crucified One, not someone else. In his glorious body he bears indelible wounds: wounds that have become windows of hope. Let us turn our gaze to him that he may heal the wounds of an afflicted humanity". (Pope Francis, Easter message 2020).

It was in those circumstances of fear and sadness the Risen Lord came to Mary Magdalene and to His disciples. After the disciples saw the Risen Lord they all were filled with joy and peace. After Mary Magdalen encountered the Risen Lord and she went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord." After the two disciples of Emmaus recognized the Risen Lord in the breaking of bread, their sadness turned into joy.

The message of the Risen Lord for us even in the midst of COVID-19 pandemic and the Ukraine war, is that of peace and hope. In the midst of this darkness the Church's proclamation echoes throughout the world: "Jesus Christ is risen!" – "He is truly risen!" "Christ, my hope, has arisen!" (Easter Sequence).

As we celebrate Easter in the midst of this pandemic and war, we are reminded that this Easter is not merely an anniversary of the first Easter Morning. The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is not a myth. Mary of Magdala saw Him. The disciples in the Upper Room touched Him after he rose from the dead. It is not something of the past. Today is Easter! Today, Jesus is Risen! Today Jesus is in our midst and He wants to come in our lives and fill us with His peace even in the midst fear, suffering, and sadness caused by the pandemic and war. As we celebrate Easter, we are invited to share in Jesus' triumph and victory. Let that victory and triumph touch your lives and give us peace. Let us open our hearts and invite Him in. Let the risen Lord become real to you and dispel darkness of all kinds... Today... Now.

On behalf of Fr. Russ, our Deacons Emmett, Paul, Andy, the entire parish staff and leaders, I wish you and your loved ones a Blessed, Happy, and Peaceful Easter! May the Risen Jesus become even more alive in your life, and in your families, and fill you with His peace! Happy Easter!
