The Most Reverend Timothy Christian Senior

12th Bishop of the Diocese of Harrisburg

Bishop Timothy C. Senior was born in North Wales, Pennsylvania, to James Harwood (d. 1977) and Elise (née Rothwell) Senior on March 22, 1960. The youngest of three children, he has a brother, Jim, and a sister, Myra. He attended St. Rose of Lima Elementary School and graduated from Lansdale Catholic High School in 1977. He then studied at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in Overbrook, Pennsylvania, obtaining a Bachelor of Philosophy degree in 1981. Bishop Senior is a classically trained pianist.

Bishop Senior was ordained to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia by Cardinal John Krol on May 18, 1985. He earned Master of Divinity and Master of Arts in pastoral theology degrees from St. Charles Seminary in 1988. After his ordination, Senior was appointed parochial vicar at Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish in Feasterville, Pennsylvania, serving there until 1988.

Bishop Senior briefly taught religion at Archbishop Kennedy High School in Conshohocken, Pennsylvania, (1988–89) before pursuing full-time graduate studies at Boston College. He received a Master of Social Work degree and Master of Business Administration in 1992. During his studies, Bishop Senior also worked as executive assistant to the secretary for social services in the Archdiocese of Boston (1991–92).

On returning to Philadelphia, Bishop Senior worked as Deputy Secretary for Catholic Human Services from 1992 to 1997, when he became Secretary. In this position, he oversaw the governance and operation of the network of Catholic health care and social services ministries sponsored by the archdiocese. Bishop Senior was raised to the rank of chaplain to his holiness by Pope John Paul II in 1998, and prelate of honor in 2005. In 2004, Bishop Senior was named archdiocesan Vicar for Clergy by Cardinal Justin Rigali. In addition to his duties as vicar, he resided at and served as chaplain at Divine Providence Village, a facility for people with intellectual disabilities, in Springfield, Pennsylvania.

Bishop Senior was appointed as Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia and Titular Bishop of Floriana by Pope Benedict XVI on June 8, 2009. He received his episcopal consecration on July 31, 2009, at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul in Philadelphia. From 2009 to 2012, Bishop Senior served as the Moderator of the Curia for the Archdiocese. In July 2012, Archbishop Charles J. Chaput appointed Bishop Senior Rector of St. Charles Borromeo Seminary, the highest administrative office of the seminary. In July 2022, Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez appointed Bishop Senior Chancellor of that seminary and gave him responsibility for the seminary's move to Lower Gwynedd Township.

The Diocese of Harrisburg was established on March 3, 1868. It covers 15 counties in south and central Pennsylvania, including: Adams, Columbia, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Mifflin, Montour, Northumberland, Perry, Snyder, Union and York. The Diocese has 97 parishes and missions, 35 Catholic schools, and is home to approximately 201,000 registered Catholics.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In his *Angelus* message for the Twelfth Sunday of Ordinary Time, in 2008, Pope Benedict XVI offered this reflection:

In this Sunday's Gospel we find two invitations from Jesus: on the one hand to "have no fear" of human beings, and on the other, to "fear" God (cf. Mt 10: 26, 28). We are thus encouraged to reflect on the difference that exists between human fears and the fear of God. Fear is a natural dimension of life. In childhood we experience forms of fear that subsequently are revealed to be imaginary and disappear; other fears emerge later which are indeed founded in reality: these must be faced and overcome with human determination and trust in God. However, especially today, there is a deeper form of fear of an existential type and which sometimes borders on anguish: it is born from a sense of emptiness, linked to a certain culture permeated with widespread theoretical and practical nihilism.

In the face of the broad and diversified panorama of human fears, the Word of God is clear: those who "fear" God "are not afraid". Fear of God, which the Scriptures define as "the beginning of knowledge" coincides with faith in him, with sacred respect for his authority over life and the world.

To be without "fear of God" is equivalent to putting ourselves in his place, to feeling we ourselves are lords of good and evil, of life and death. Instead, those who fear God feel within them the safety that an infant in his mother's arms feels (cf. Ps 130: 2). Those who fear God are tranquil even in the midst of storms for, as Jesus revealed to us, God is a Father full of mercy and goodness. Those who love him are not afraid: "There is no fear in love", the Apostle John wrote, "but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and he who fears is not perfected in love" (1 Jn 4: 18). Believers, therefore, are not afraid of anything because they know they are in the hands of God, they know that it is not evil and the irrational which have the last word, but rather that the one Lord of the world and of love is Christ, the Word of God Incarnate,

who loved us to the point of sacrificing himself for us, dying on the Cross for our salvation.

The more we grow in this intimacy with God, imbued with love, the more easily we overcome any form of fear. In the passage of today's Gospel, Jesus repeats several times the exhortation to have no fear. Jesus reassures us, as he reassured the Apostles and as he did St Paul by appearing to him one night in a vision at a particularly difficult moment in his preaching: "Do not be afraid", he said, "for I am with you" (Acts 18: 9). Strong in the presence of Christ and comforted by his love, the Apostle to the Gentiles, the 2,000th anniversary of whose birth we are preparing to celebrate with a special Jubilee Year, did not even fear martyrdom. May this great spiritual and pastoral event inspire in us too a renewed trust in Jesus Christ who calls us to proclaim and witness to his Gospel without being afraid of anything. ... Let us immediately entrust this ecclesial initiative to the intercession of St Paul and of Mary Most Holy, Queen of Apostles and Mother of Christ, the source of our joy and our peace.¹

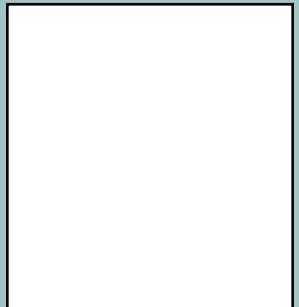
