



We were invited to present on "**Making the Parish the Center of the New Evangelization.**" We had a lot of fun with it, as it gave us a chance to **tell OUR (Saint J's) STORY** and share what we have learned over the years in ministry. I am in awe at what God is doing!!

## NOVENA TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

As Pentecost, the Birthday of the Church, fast approaches, I would like to share a Novena I was blessed to receive many years ago: **Novena to the Holy Spirit** by *George E. Schulhoff, A.H.S.* I will include the first three days (Friday - Sunday) in this week's bulletin and then the subsequent six days, in next Sunday's Bulletin. **PLEASE JOIN ME IN PRAYING THIS EACH DAY. COME HOLY SPIRIT!**

### THE FIRST NOVENA\*

After Jesus ascended to Heaven His Apostles, together with Mary and other members of the original Christian Church, continued to pray together until the feast of Pentecost when, in accordance with Jesus' promise, "*they were all filled with the Holy Spirit.*" *These nine days of prayer, reported in Acts 1:14 and 2:3-4, were the first Novena on which all later Novenas have been based.*

### INTRODUCTION

No one could possibly love you more than God the Holy Spirit. You have given and received only natural love. God's love is supernatural. His love for you is unlimited. He created you. Just as you are. Just as He wanted you to be. He wants you to know Him. He wants you to be happy and enjoy this world and this life He gave you. With His gifts, He gives you all you need to accomplish this. He wants to give you unlimited WISDOM, KNOWLEDGE and UNDERSTANDING. He wants to COUNSEL you and give you FORTITUDE. He wants to make it easy for you to be close and intimate with Him through His gift to you of PIETY. He wants to create in you a love for Him that will satisfy every want and desire you have.

When Jesus lived on the earth with His disciples, they were content to give up everything to follow Him, just to be near Him. With Him, they were safe and if they needed any COUNSEL they knew He could give them the answers. The disciples had never experienced or even heard of such a source of comfort and WISDOM on earth. So when it was time for Him to leave they were very upset. He assured them by telling them He would send the Paraclete, the Comforter to be with them and with all of His followers.

When He lived as a man He could only be touched and seen and known by as many as humanly possible. By sending His Spirit He could be present, in Spirit, to all, at all times. The Holy Spirit speaks to you in your thoughts. He prompts or speaks to you in your language, using your grammar and the words you are familiar with and use daily. These thoughts or promptings that come from the Holy Spirit are so natural that unless you are sensitive to His promptings you could easily ignore them or not recognize them as important.

During these nine days of reflection on the Holy Spirit, you will pray, meditate, contemplate, ponder, concentrate, reflect, use your imagination and listen. The author has practiced this devotion from the age of five to the present day (76 years). He has explained this devotion to numerous others who have accepted the information they received from him. Many have been able to apply the devotion to their own lives & are astonished it has not been taught to a greater extent.

Those who have been instructed personally by the author have been able to acquire the devotion in a matter of weeks, months or several years, and even surpassed what he himself has experienced.

Each day, mull over the thought presented to you, for as long as you can. Read and re-read the day. Each time you get a thought, stop and ponder it. Exhaust it before continuing. Your goal is to listen to your thoughts, not to get through it. Imagine there is no such thing as time. Avoid advancing to the following days in an effort to get new information and ideas to fill in the time and blanks you will have. This is precisely what kills meditation. Too much information. Remember, you are not trying to find thoughts and answers from the same sources you are accustomed to using, such as reading. You are trying to hear new thoughts from a different source. This will not be information, this will be KNOWLEDGE. The Holy Spirit will be putting words in your thoughts.

### **DAY ONE - Friday May 14th**

HELLO!

O Holy Spirit, I began this Novena by admitting that I do not KNOW you. I know about you, from what I have been told. I have been told how God the Father, my creator and God the Son, My Savior, sent You God the Holy Spirit, to be with me. To comfort me, be my advocate, sanctify me.

MUSCLE BUILDER

I am ashamed, after all You have done for me, that I have never taken the time to learn how to open my heart and let You in.

It is my hope, at this moment, You will give me the STRENGTH to be DETERMINED and PERSEVERE and to constantly have You as my companion. I KNOW how weak I am since I have had other good intentions and failed. I failed in the past because I did not realize it is You who must provide me with Your seven spiritual gifts.

Your gift of FORTITUDE will give me STRENGTH I need to complete this Novena. Instill in me, O Holy Spirit, Your gift of FORTITUDE so I can carry on, to do what I must do, to complete this Novena.

### **DAY TWO - Saturday May 15th**

I'M SORRY

O Holy Spirit, my curiosity has tempted me to begin reading this second day of my Novena instead of spending this time trying to learn how to listen to Your promptings. I always know better than my teacher and did not think it would make any difference. I do not let You guide me because I do not KNOW how to listen to You. In fact, I do not even listen to those who have had the experience of learning how to listen.

WAKE ME UP

Give me Your gift of COUNSEL by reminding me numerous times during this day to talk to You as I would talk to my very best human friend.

COUNSEL me by reminding me to dwell on these thoughts of my first and second day of this Novena.

GIVE ME A SHOVE

Remind me, O Holy Spirit, to express my gratitude to You who have given me so much. My faith, hope and ability to love. My home, friends, relatives and the fact I have life.

Do not let me be one of the nine lepers who did not return to show gratitude.  
Thank You, O Holy Spirit, thank You.

### **DAY THREE - Sunday May 16th**

GET IT!

Already You are giving me, O Holy Spirit, an UNDERSTANDING of how I must spend this moment thinking about You in my heart. You are beginning to let me UNDERSTAND that simply by reading this information will not release Your grace. I am beginning to realize Your gift of UNDERSTANDING comes to me from You, when I take the time to accept Your COUNSEL. For this realization and the gifts You have given me, thank You, O Holy Spirit.

"AND LEAD US NOT INTO \_\_\_\_\_"

Please do not lead me into temptation, O Holy Spirit! Do not put me to the test that I must prove to You my faith, by making me wait longer to experience Your presence, if for only one second. This second of knowing that You are in my heart will increase my faith. O Holy Spirit, I do believe, help my unbelief.

Make me UNDERSTAND the only reason I am starting this third day of getting to know You is through and with the FORTITUDE You have provided. If I listen to my pride, I would think I am doing it all by myself.



**How has St. J's most blessed you in the past 6 months?**

- The pandemic has certainly caused all of us some stressful moments but the Lord works in mysterious ways! Saint J's and the JOY Movement have given me a deeper understanding about my Catholic faith. Saint J's has also blessed me during the last several months by conducting the many virtual meetings (eg: The Marian and No Greater Love "retreats", Pastoral Council meetings), my membership in the Holy Name Society and the live streaming of Holy Mass and Holy Hours. I also enjoy supporting all the events we now have for the young people of our parishes because it reminds me of my early days growing up Catholic. All the extra work and coordination by our priests, the collaborative staff and ministry volunteers are all for the benefit of others. It is the JOY Movement in action! I think Lent and Holy Week at Saint J's had to be the best ever! I am so grateful to be a part of this Collaborative.

**Tell us about your family (place of birth, family background, current family)**

- I was born at St. Margaret's Hospital, Dorchester and spent the first 10 years of my life in Jamaica Plain at Our Lady of Lourdes (OLOL) parish and school. I remember serving as an Altar Server at OLOL and knowing all the Latin responses one year before I was eligible to become an Altar Server! When my family moved to Weymouth Landing, I transferred to Sacred Heart Grammar and eventually Sacred Heart High School, Weymouth. I attended North Adams State College and graduated with a degree in psychology with a minor in business. My father worked at Whiting's and Hood's Milk Companies in Somerville as well as Hendrie's Ice Cream in Milton. My mother was a "stay at home" Mom until later in life when she worked for Electro Switch Company in Weymouth (to help pay for college tuition for me and my three sisters!). My mother loved OLOL and Sacred Heart Church's and helped in many ways whenever there was a need for her skills.

**Who is Jesus to you? How/when did you encounter Jesus as your personal savior?**

- Jesus is my friend. He has unconditional love of me despite my faults and sins. How can you not love someone back when they love you so much unconditionally? I say good morning to him (and the Blessed Mother) every morning

and thank them each night for the good and the not so good things that may have happened during the day. Jesus is comfort. I have some special prayers that I say and feel a special bond with Jesus when I say them. My relationship with Jesus is a work in progress. The JOY Movement has made this relationship more meaningful than I ever expected.

**Tell us about your Personal Vocation (married, single, widow, widower, children)**

- My wife and I have three married sons. We are blessed with one granddaughter and are particularly grateful for our expanding family that God has given us. Our adult family include two college professors, a Southwest Airline flight attendant, two bank executives and an active-duty USAF Technical Sargent. I started my business life at Blue Cross and Blue Shield (where I met my wife), and have also worked for health insurance companies in Freeport, Maine and Queens, New York. My most interesting job was from 2003 to 2008 which involved travelling the United States to 42 states and over 100 cities/towns. Ask me about the Bill Clinton library visit next time you see me! Presently I have been employed since 2008 by the state of Massachusetts and work in public safety.

**What are your Interests/Hobbies/Talents? What do you do for fun?**

- I have been involved in amateur and professional baseball since 1999. I have taught pitching to players ages 9 through 18 and have been an associate scout for the S.F. Giants. Teaching pitching to young players has been very rewarding as it has enabled me to meet hundreds of players and their families.

**Is there anything we did not ask that you wished we did?**

- What is it like to volunteer for different ministries at our parishes? Participating in several ministries over the years has been very rewarding. They include RICA, Pre Cana, CCD, Lecturer, Eucharistic Minister, Pastoral Council, Holy Name Society and helping at fellowship events. These ministries showed me up close about the priests, deacons and the staff of a catholic parish and how they are so very dedicated, holy, caring and thoughtful. You get to know that all they do are for you and the benefit of others. It is another example of JOY Movement in action!

## CONFIRMATION 2021 UPDATE

We're getting so close to this special day! Please keep our Confirmandi in your prayers. Upcoming dates and notes:

### Confirmation Retreat: Saturday, May 15 and Sunday, May 16

Please arrive at Saint John's lower church by 9:45 each morning. Wear comfortable clothes and shoes. We'll be running, moving and experiencing the holy spirit. Saturday pickup time will be 5 PM. Sunday pickup time will be 6 PM, but you're welcome to stay for Youth Group from 6-8 PM.

### Confirmation Ceremony: Thursday, May 20

As you know, we have two ceremony times on May 20; one at 5pm and again at 7pm. You and your child should have already selected the time you plan to attend, but if you haven't please be sure to do so by contacting Adriana Goodfellow at [Micjames456@gmail.com](mailto:micjames456@gmail.com) ASAP! Please note, if your child has not completed their paperwork and requirements that they should have it turned in ASAP as well.

The ceremony will be a shortened form with a Liturgy of the Word, Confirmation, Prayers of the Faithful, and Closing Prayer celebrated by the Very Reverend Robert L. Connors. There will be no liturgy of the Eucharist due to COVID.

The Confirmandi should arrive one hour prior to the time of their ceremony. They will be issued and wear ROBES. **\*Please arrive at 4 PM for 5 o'clock ceremony or 6 PM for 7 o'clock.\***

Families/Households sit together in the pews, with Confirmandi on aisle seats. Sponsors will sit a row behind Confirmandi on aisle seats. Due to Covid regulations, there will be no procession in, no photos after the ceremony, and no gathering outside the church afterwards. IT IS CRUCIAL you do not gather outside after the ceremony.

### Confirmation Certificate Mass: Sunday, May 23

Please arrive at 10:30am. Confirmation certificates will be distributed at the 11am Mass on May 23rd (the Sunday following the Confirmation ceremony). Here you can gather, take pictures and linger (ROBES will be issued and worn). All Confirmandi MUST report to Saint John's Lawn on SUNDAY, May 23 at 10:30am for the 11:00am Mass (FAMILIES welcome and drive in option for elder family members may be a safer option than actual ceremony). Note: Certificate Sunday Confirmandi names will be called and Confirmandi will receive certificates.

Lastly, if you have not already submitted your Catholic Basics test, we look forward to seeing you on May 1st after the 4 PM Mass or on May 2nd after the 11 AM Mass. This is also JOY Weekend at Saint J's and we'd love your help or just a "hello".

We are overjoyed to celebrate this sacrament with your children and families and look forward to seeing you soon! **COME HOLY SPIRIT!**

Please join other parishioners who turn to our Blessed Virgin Mary to intercede to free us from what binds and confuses us:





