

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION



This past Sunday our Parishes celebrated First Holy Communion for seven of our children. It is always an exciting and memorable time for families, the children and the parish community. Who doesn't recall their First Holy Communion? The white dress or suit? Getting dressed up? The priest who administered the Holy Eucharist to you? The joy of your parents, grandparents, family? You remember your First Holy Communion for your entire life!



WHY? Why do we remember? Because we actually believe it is Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity; truly and actually and substantially present, under the appearances of bread and wine. Our parents and our church **make a "big deal" out of it** because our **TRADITION** has taught, proclaimed and celebrated this truth (of **Christ's TRUE PRESENCE**). Where do we get this tradition and teaching? **Jesus Himself:**

Matthew 26:26-28

"26 Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is my body."

27 And he took a chalice, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you; 28 for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."

We believe it to be true **because Jesus said it** and the **Church took Him at His Word (Gospel)** and has done what He told us to do (**Tradition**).

John 6:55-56

"55 For my flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. 56 He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him."


OPENING UP OUR CHURCHES: Both of our churches will now be opened daily for anyone to visit with the Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament:

Saint John the Baptist (lower church): Monday - Friday (2:00pm-7:00pm)


TWO SAINTS OF THE OUTDOORS

One of my heroes and favorite saints is **Pope Saint John Paul II**. Can you recognize him in this picture? Of the many aspects of his life, teaching and witness, I love the way he sought to accompany others on the journey of life. In his early years as a University Chaplain and Professor in Krakow, he would do outdoor excursions with young people. The outdoor journey into God's beautiful creation provided a spectacular environment for faith and fellowship as companions on the journey. During these trips, whether they be the mountains for a hike or skiing, or bodies of



water for swimming and kayaking, John Paul and his companions would take time to celebrate Holy Mass (benefit of traveling with a priest:)); To worship Jesus Christ, and to receive Him in His Body and Blood. The **root word of "companion"** comes from the Latin: "com" (meaning "together with") and "panis" (meaning bread). From this we get the Old French the word "campaignon" which means **"one who breaks bread with another."** From this word we get the Middle English word: "companion." Isn't this what Jesus did with the Disciples on the **Road to Emmaus** in the 24th Chapter of Luke? And it was in the "breaking of the Bread" (Eucharist) that they recognized Him (Christ).

Another outdoorsmen who reached the heights of sanctity is **Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati**. Bl. Frassati was born in Turin, Italy in 1901. "At an early age, he joined the Marian Sodality and the Apostleship of Prayer, and obtained permission to receive daily Communion (which was rare at that time)."



"He developed a deep spiritual life which he never hesitated to share with his friends. The Holy Eucharist and the Blessed Virgin were the two poles of his world of prayer. At the age of 17, he joined the St. Vincent de Paul Society and dedicated much of his spare time to serving the sick and the needy, caring for orphans, and assisting the demobilized servicemen returning from World War I."

"Mountain climbing was one of his favorite sports. Outings in the mountains, which he organized with his friends, also served as opportunities for his apostolic work. He never lost the chance to lead his friends to Mass, to the reading of Scripture, and to praying the rosary." (<https://frassatiusa.org/frassati-biography>).



One of the mottoes associated with Pier Giorgio, which is a personal favorite of mine, is **"Verso l'alto" or "To the Heights."** "Pier Giorgio actually wrote these words himself on the back of the photo which was taken by a fellow climber on June 7, 1925. Because of Pier Giorgio's sudden death one month later, it turned out to be his last climb. So, although it was never his personal motto, "Verso l'alto" became **representative of Pier Giorgio's earthly life -- a constant striving to reach the summit of eternal life.** It has become the motto of many people who have a devotion to him." (<https://frassatiusa.org/frassati-biography>). His devotion and love for the Eucharist and the poor are beautifully captured in this quote:

"Jesus comes to me every morning in Communion, and I return the visit by going to serve the poor."

We recently purchased **new audio and visual equipment** for the use of our parishes. Most pressing was the need to upgrade our sound system for outdoor events/liturgies, especially the 11am Outdoor Mass, as well as our live-streaming technology (11am gets a lot of traffic and we have been borrowing from others to make it work). We are grateful to the Holy Name Society who said they would help with the costs. All donations are welcome. **Total Need: \$5,051.10.**

For the weekend of July 9th-11th a number of our young people will be traveling to **Franciscan University of Steubenville** for one of their **annual youth conferences**. Due to the number of people going, I decided that it was **safer for us to get a bus** rather than a couple of fifteen passenger vans. This will also allow us time to bond as a group, pray and process well and have a jolly old good time! **If 11 parishioners (it was 12) gave gifts of \$500 each** it would almost cover the entire cost of the bus. It was a parishioner who proposed this idea and then said he would support it and believes we would easily find 11 others. :). Thanks Dad!! I know that is bold, and of course our teens and their families are so grateful for assistance offered; most especially your prayers for a life-changing encounter with Jesus Christ. 
